#### **Dyslexia and Our Journey**

#### **Proposal**

Staff will present information regarding the impact of Assembly Bill 1369, Special Education: Dyslexia, and the work of the Laguna Beach Unified School District's Dyslexia Work group.

#### **Background**

On August 14, 2017, the California Superintendent of Public Instruction released "the California Dyslexia Guidelines," as required by Assembly Bill 1369 (2015) and California Education Code Sections 56334 and 56335. The Dyslexia Guidelines is a long-awaited document meant to define dyslexia and identify responsive, research-based interventions. It is intended to assist general education teachers, special education teachers, and parents in identifying, assessing, and supporting students with dyslexia. Brain imagery has shown that people with dyslexia process word identification differently, and children do not outgrow dyslexia. Dyslexia is unrelated to intelligence, but students have long floundered without the correct help. The Guidelines draw on both current research and the collective professional wisdom and experience of the members of the State's Dyslexia Guidelines Work Group which met between April 2016 and March 2017. The Guidelines state that dyslexia may "be understood as one type of a specific learning disability (SLD)," and is "characterized by difficulties with accurate and/or fluent word recognition and by poor spelling and decoding abilities."

The California State Dyslexia Guidelines address:

- Screening and assessment
- Assessment tools
- Special Education and 504 plans
- Current understanding of the neuroscience behind dyslexia
- Dyslexia and English Learners
- Preparation of and for educators
- Effective approaches and strategies for teaching students with dyslexia
- Assistive technology and dyslexia
- Information for parents and guardians

The purpose of this Board Study Session is to provide guidelines, raise awareness, and increase understanding of the characteristics of dyslexia. Dyslexia is the most common form of learning disability. It affects one in ten individuals, and it affects more than reading. Undiagnosed children are often labeled as "lazy or disruptive" and suffer low self-esteem and social-emotional development issues result. Our presentation will outline

a Multi-Tiered System of Supports (MTSS) for addressing dyslexia in the general education program as well as provide information around our Dyslexia Committee's four areas of focus: Screening and Assessment, Instruction, Training, and Parent Partnerships.

What our team has learned is:

- Teachers trained in early dyslexia identification and intervention can maintain students in general education classrooms and the least restrictive environment
- Strategies teachers learn benefit all students
- Early intervention is key to success
- Late or delayed intervention does not produce the same benefits as early intervention
- Specific Learning Disability (SLD) is an umbrella term and does not prohibit the use of the term "dyslexia" when determining special education eligibility and educational services
- Core deficits associated with dyslexia must be assessed when considering special education eligibility under the category of SLD

The Dyslexia Work group's accomplishments to date will be shared, including our current plan of action.

LBUSD created a computer science/literacy committee in the Fall of 2017. This committee identified the need for a more coordinated effort to implement the computer science standards. A more detailed skills continuum, as well as staffing, was identified as a need. School Power fund-a-need was successful in raising \$185,500 to support the implementation. A District-wide Digital Media and Library Specialist and a Teacher On Special Assignment (TOSA) for K-12 Computer Science were hired. LBUSD is now in the process of developing and implementing the California State Computer Science Standards.

At the 20 minute mark, Member Brown moved to extend the time for speakers. Member Normandin seconded. Motion carried 5-0.

Member Wolff moved to approve the 2019-2020 student instructional calendar as presented. Member Brown seconded.

#### **Board Discussion**

Member Wolff outlined the goals of the committee as previously stated during the August 21, 2018 Board meeting. She stated the Board requested options and believes that through meetings and conversations a compromise has been reached.

Member Normandin stated she had been on the fence regarding the change; however, after attending the Challenge Success conference, and participating in Board meeting discussions, she believes this is what is best for kids. She stated students will not lose scholarships, the festival has stated they will change schedules as needed, and the calendar as presented gives students more choices to attend end of the year opportunities.

Member Brown stated she too is a beach person and loves Laguna for all its uniqueness. She is proud of the students who spoke on August 21 and wants to listen to the students. In response to comments regarding changing the calendar to better fit the needs of teachers whose students do not attend school in LBUSD, Member Brown stated that teachers have the opportunity to bring their own children to attend school in LBUSD. She stated this has been a transparent process.

Member Perry stated she is sad this issue is separating the community. She provided pros and cons on both sides. She agreed that summer is magical and she also stated the loss of opportunities in June is important to consider. She requested a follow-up survey be conducted. She also requested the Board be provided with a list in June of what opportunities students miss.

Student Board Representative, Piper Warner, asked if students want the change, why parents won't listen. She has spoken with other students in other districts and they believe the schedule is better.

Member Normandin stated the names of people who signed the petition on Change.org are not released and therefore the data is not reliable. The district survey was representative of all. She trusts district educators. She also stated that research has shown that a clean winter break is important for students with at risk behavior.

President Vickers clarified information presented by several speakers:

- The proposed calendar change was a result of discussions brought about in district negotiations with LaBUFA. Those negotiations are not public.
- Changes to the original proposed calendar were a result of comments from parents, staff, and community members from the study session and subsequent meetings. Changes were not made by the Board or staff behind the scenes arbitrarily.
- This process has taken place over the course of a year and has been very transparent.
- The Board is concerned with all students and providing a better process for all students.
- Many changes have occurred over the years in Laguna Beach.

Student Board Representative Piper Warner cast a provisional vote in favor. Motion carried 5-0. Members Vickers, Perry, Brown, Normandin, and Wolff voted yes.

Public Comment: Sheri Morgan asked the Board to look broadly at bullying and help students understand what bullying is, specifically the nuisances between bullying and being funny.

Howard Hills stated the best way to educate kids is for the Board and adults to set a good example.

Member Normandin moved approval, member Brown seconded.

President Vickers called for a roll call vote.

Student Board Representative Piper Warner cast a provisional vote in favor. Motion carried 5-0. Members Vickers, Perry, Brown, Normandin, and Wolff voted yes.

- Multimedia Production, Multimedia Design, 3D Multimedia Design
- After bell schedule elective courses which are open to students at LBHS as well as students from surrounding school districts:
  - o Medical/Hospital Careers course with Internship
  - o Medical Terminology
  - o Emergency Medical Responder
  - o Programming/Coding

# **Background**

CCA will employ Scott Wittkop, a LBUSD teacher, on a 60% contract basis for the 2018-2019 school year to provide Multimedia Design, Multimedia Production and Multimedia 3D Design classes. CCA agrees to reimburse LBUSD for the salary cost of Mr. Wittkop's 60% contract and statutory payroll benefits costs. LBUSD will invoice CCA for this expense at the end of the 2018-2019 school year.

CCA will employ Estee Fratzke, a LBUSD teacher, on a 40% contract basis for the 2018-2019 school year to provide Dance III and Dance Company classes. CCA agrees to reimburse LBUSD for the salary cost of Mrs. Fratzke's 40% contract, and statutory payroll benefits costs. LBUSD will invoice CCA for this expense at the end of the 2018-2019 school year an amount not to exceed \$140,000.00.

CCA will provide an instructor for the after school Medical/Hospital Careers Internship course. Additional teacher pay is incurred for this course to cover the monitoring of internships, developing partnership agreements, collaborating with site supervisors, and regular required reporting. The course is being offered during the fall semester of the 2018/19 school year. LBUSD will reimburse CCA in the amount of \$5,000.00 per semester for the additional cost of this course.

# **Budget Impact**

LBUSD will invoice CCA for approximately \$140,000 and will pay CCA roughly \$176,000. Additionally, \$5,000.00 per semester will be paid to CCA by LBUSD. As a result, LBUSD will contribute roughly \$50,000 to CCA, which will be paid by the General Fund.

# **Recommended Action**

Staff recommends the Board of Education approve the MOU between College and Career Advantage Regional Occupational Program (CCA) and Laguna Beach Unified School District (LBUSD) to offer the above-described elective courses at Laguna Beach High School during the 2018-2019 school year.

Laguna Beach Unified School District Student Achievement and Assessment Results for the 2017-18 School Year will be Presented by Staff in Alignment with District LCAP Goals

# **Proposal**

Staff will present information to the School Board regarding the 2017-18 student achievement and assessment results and their alignment with our District LCAP.

# **Background**

The Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) is a part of California's Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF). It is a three-year, district-level plan that is updated annually. The LCAP describes the district's key goals, actions, services, expenditures, and metrics used to measure progress for students. The LBUSD is currently in the second year of the 2017-2020 LCAP.

District leaders use this data to inform practices, measure annual growth, explore student interventions, determine future professional development, and develop the district LCAP. Site leaders use this assessment data as well as formative assessments to identify goals and action steps during the school year.

Professional Learning Communities (PLCs), in place at every school, are focused on the collaborative use of this data as part of a cycle of inquiry and professional learning. In this environment of more rigorous standards and assessments, as well as data-driven PLCs, teachers utilize common assessments that provide feedback on student mastery of standards. Sites implement identified student achievement goals through PLCs, professional development, and rigorous lesson planning.

Site goals, aligned with District LCAP goals, are in five areas:

#### **LCAP** Goals

- 1. Increase student academic achievement and social/emotional strength through collaboration, critical thinking, creativity, and communication
- 2. All students will gain the knowledge and skills to be college and career ready through a wide variety of academic and enrichment opportunities
- 3. Professional Development focused on 21st-century teaching and learning
- 4. Safe, attractive, clean, well-equipped learning environments for all students that promote critical thinking, collaboration, creativity, and communication

5. All stakeholders will be engaged in the learning process by promoting a variety of opportunities for parents, students, staff, and the community that strengthen communication and meaningful participation

This presentation will focus on the progress of the district in LCAP Goal 1 and 2. Last spring, Laguna Beach Unified School District students in grades 3-8 and 11 participated in the 2018 California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP) as well as several other state and national assessments. These assessments are part of California's comprehensive plan for supporting high-quality learning and college readiness at every school. Key student achievement and college readiness metrics in goals 1 and 2 include the SBAC of ELA/Literacy and Math (CAASPP), Early Assessment Program, Advanced Placement test, SAT test, ACT test, and the UC/CSU a-g rate.

#### **CAASPP**

In July, 2018, the district received its preliminary CAASPP results. The final district and state CAASPP results were released to the public at the end of September. The Laguna Beach Unified School District results are consistently at or near the best in the county and state. In Laguna Beach Unified School District, 84% of students either met or exceeded the English Language Arts/Literacy standards and 72% of students met or exceeded the Mathematics standards in the 2017-18 school year. Established in 2014, the CAASPP System is California's academic assessment system that measures California Standards achievement for grades 3 through 8 and 11 in English and mathematics. Now in its fourth year, the computer-based tests use California's challenging academic standards and ask students to write, think critically, and solve complex problems.

Overall, LBUSD scores have risen 6 percent in ELA and 8 percent in math since 2015. The table below reflects the percentage of students who met or exceeded state standards throughout all four years of the new assessment system.

#### **CAASPP Achievement: Percent Proficient**

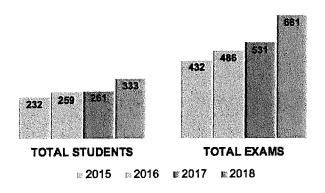
In addition to the ELA/Literacy and math assessments, students take the California Science Test (CAST), which is an online assessment based on the California Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS). The CAST is administered in grades 5 and 8 and once to each student while in high school. During the 2017-18 school year, the CAST operated as a field test to test the questions and assessment system. Districts did not receive performance-based results last year. The first operational year for the CAST will be the 2018-19 school year. LBUSD staff look forward to receiving results at the end of this school year to assess the progress in implementing NGSS.

# Advanced Placement Test, SAT, ACT, and UC/CSU a-g rate

Many Laguna Beach High School students also take the Advanced Placement (AP) test, the ACT assessment, and the SAT assessment. Along with the CAASPP results, LBUSD uses these assessments as another measure of student readiness for college and career. AP tests are taken near the end of AP classes to validate how much students learn. Many colleges also give students college-level credits based on their scores. The SAT or ACT assessment are required by most colleges as part of the college application process. They are used as a measure of student's readiness for colleges. The SAT provides feedback on student performance in mathematics and evidence-based reading and writing. The ACT measures student learning in four areas, English, reading, mathematics, and science. Overall student scores for these three high school level assessments are also used as part of the school profile that is submitted during the college admission process.

In recent years, the number of students taking AP tests and the number of AP exams has increased while the maintaining a pass rate (scores of 3 or higher) above 90 percent.

# **Advanced Placement Tests**



More than half, 51 percent, of last year's LBHS graduating class passed an AP test. This rate is 20 percentage points greater than the average for all California students, 30 percent. Seventy-seven percent of these same students also completed the necessary courses for admission to the University of California (UC) and California State University (CSU). LBUSD students achieve at a comparatively high rate in the two other prominent national assessments, the ACT and SAT.

Beach Unified School District in an Amount Not-to-Exceed \$21,200

# **Proposal**

Staff proposes the Board of Education approve the purchase of OverDrive Digital Library for implementation throughout Laguna Beach Unified School District's school libraries in 2018/2019.

# **Background**

In 2014 LBUSD started its one to one/BYOD computer program. Providing online audio and digital books is a natural extension of this project, and will allow students to download materials at any time including on weekends, during breaks, and even during the summer months. OverDrive is a digital reading platform and online library that can be built to meet any districts needs. Additionally, digital materials are never lost or destroyed. Once the time allotted for the material is reached, it is automatically checked back into the online system. At a cost of approximately \$17 per ebook and \$40 per audiobook, the initial collection will be approximately 950 ebooks and 100 audiobooks. This also includes licensing for a kiosk to preview the digital books.

Sora, an Overdrive app created for schools, will provide students and teachers with one-touch access to a district-wide customizable digital book collection of fiction, non-fiction, district authored, and leveled-reader content supporting 21st Century Learning. Students will be able to achieve digital badges for reading. check their reading stats, and take notes or highlight within ebooks. Additionally, teachers will be able to curate their own mini collections to push to classes, monitor student progress, and publish student-created content within the district.

The Overdrive platform is compatible with all major digital devices, including desktop computers, IOS and Android mobile devices, Chromebooks, Kindle and Nook readers and provides online and offline reading access on these devices.

# **Budget Impact**

The budget impact of the OverDrive Digital Library will be a cost of \$21,200 for the first year of implementation. This will be paid from existing SchoolPower funds.

### **Recommended Action**

Staff recommends the Board of Education approve the purchase of the OverDrive Digital Library for the 2018/2019 School Year.

# LAGUNA BEACH UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT ALCOHOL AND OTHER DRUGS

BP 5131.6

Students

The Governing Board believes that the use of alcohol or other drugs adversely affects a student's ability to achieve academic success, is physically and emotionally harmful, and has serious social and legal consequences. The Board desires to keep district schools free of alcohol and other drugs in order to help prevent violence, promote school safety and create a well-disciplined environment conducive to learning.

The Superintendent or designee shall develop, implement and evaluate a comprehensive prevention and intervention program that is coordinated with other school and community-based services and programs. The district's program shall be scientifically based and designed to prevent or reduce alcohol or other drug use and the possession and distribution of illegal drugs. It shall include primary prevention activities such as decision-making skills and conflict management, instruction, referral to a rehabilitation program, enforcement/discipline, activities that promote the involvement of parents/guardians and coordination with appropriate community agencies and organizations.

The Board and Superintendent shall agree upon performance measures that will be used to monitor and determine the effectiveness of the district's program in reducing drug and alcohol use. The Superintendent or designee shall develop and implement an evaluation process that includes ongoing assessment and analysis of objective data regarding the incidence of drug and alcohol use among district students, including discipline problems, and the prevalence of risk factors.

The Superintendent or designee shall consult with principals, teachers, other school personnel, students and parents/guardians when developing the district's program.

The Superintendent or designee shall clearly communicate to all students, staff and parents/guardians the district's policies, regulations and school rules related to the use of alcohol and other drugs on school campuses or at school activities. Information about program needs and goals shall be widely distributed in the community.

Staff should encourage students to participate as responsible partners in efforts to maintain a safe, constructive school climate.

The Board encourages the establishment of district-level advisory groups to assist in promoting alcohol- and drug-free schools.

The district's drug education program shall augment county drug education services, if any. District staff shall take every opportunity to cooperate with county and county office of education staff in planning and implementing collaborative alcohol and drug prevention programs.

#### Instruction

The district shall provide science-based preventative instruction which has been proven effective in helping students avoid the use of alcohol and other drugs.

All instruction and related materials shall consistently state that unlawful use of alcohol or other drugs is wrong and harmful. Instruction shall not include the concept of responsible use of drugs or alcohol when such use is illegal.

The district shall offer staff development activities for staff who implement the comprehensive drug and alcohol prevention and intervention program.

Intervention, Referral and Student Assistance Programs

School staff, students and parents/guardians shall be informed about early warning signs which may indicate alcohol and other drug use and about appropriate agencies offering intervention programs, counseling, referral and other student assistance programs.

The Board strongly encourages any student who is using alcohol or drugs to discuss the matter with their parent/guardian or with any staff member. Students who disclose their use of alcohol or other drugs when seeking help from an intervention or recovery program shall not be disciplined for such use.

# Enforcement/Discipline

The Superintendent or designee shall take appropriate action to eliminate possession, use or sale of alcohol and other drugs and related paraphernalia on school grounds or at school-sponsored activities.

Students possessing, using or selling alcohol or other drugs or related paraphernalia shall be subject to disciplinary procedures including suspension or expulsion and/or referral to law enforcement in accordance with law, Board policy and administrative regulation. In addition, such students may be referred to an appropriate counseling program, transferred to an alternative placement, and/or be restricted from extracurricular activities, including athletics.

Board Policy No. 5034: STUDENTS WITH ALCOHOL OR DRUG RELATED DISABILITIES

A. The Board recognizes that, unfortunately, some students may have alcohol or drug related disabilities despite all the efforts that are made by parents, the schools and the community that students not use alcohol or illegal drugs.

B. It is the District's policy not to discriminate against a student who has an alcohol or drug related disability, who seeks to participate in treatment, or who actually participates in such treatment. However, the District strictly prohibits the following by any student:

Unlawfully possessed, used, sold, or otherwise furnished, or been under the influence of, any controlled substance (listed in Health And Safety Code sections 11053, et seg.), an alcoholic beverage, or an intoxicant of any kind.

Unlawfully offered, arranged, or negotiated to sell any controlled substance (listed in Health And Safety Code section 11053, et seq.), an alcoholic beverage, or an intoxicant of any kind, and then either sold, delivered, or otherwise furnished to any person another liquid, substance, or material and represented the liquid, substance, or material as a controlled substance, alcoholic beverage, or intoxicant.

A student may be suspended or expelled for any act in provision B related to school activity or attendance which occurs at any time, including, but not limited to, any of the following:

While on school grounds.

While going to or coming from school.

During the lunch period whether on or off the campus.

During, or while going or coming from, a school sponsored activity.

# PROHIBITIONS AGAINST ALCOHOL AND DRUGS

#### A. GENERAL.

District policies regarding prohibitions against alcohol and drug abuse are intended to convey a no-use philosophy; address the risk factors to students of such abuse identified through research and promote a student-school-community partnership and nonpunitive alternative for self-referral, staff training, parent education, the proper involvement of law enforcement personnel, student assistance programs, and a healthy exchange of information between students, parents, school personnel and other supporting agencies while protecting confidentiality at all times.

The District Governing Board believes that prevention and early intervention efforts are critical factors in the District's efforts to help students to avoid disruptive effects of suspension and expulsion for drug and alcohol related offenses and drug/alcohol abuse. The District also recognizes its obligations to students with alcohol or drug related disabilities. The District is committed to making reasonable efforts at early intervention in cases in which a student has violated this policy or the same provisions contained in Board Policy 5014 (Student Discipline: Suspension and Expulsion). However, in cases in which expulsion is required by law for certain drug/alcohol offenses, or in cases in which there has been a second drug/alcohol offense, early intervention efforts are not feasible.

### B. POLICY PROHIBITIONS AND DISCIPLINARY ACTION.

- 1. While it is the District's policy not to discriminate against a student who has an alcohol or drug related disability, and who seeks to participate in treatment, or who actually participates in such treatment, the District strictly prohibits and will take disciplinary action against any student for the following offenses:
  - a. Unlawfully possessed, used, sold, or otherwise furnished, or been under the influence of, any controlled substance (listed in Health And Safety Code sections 11053 et seq.), an alcoholic beverage, or an intoxicant of any kind.
  - b. Unlawfully offered, arranged, or negotiated to sell any controlled substance (listed in Health And Safety Code section 11053 et seq.), an alcoholic beverage, or an intoxicant of any kind, and then either sold, delivered, or otherwise furnished to any person another liquid, substance, or material and represented the liquid, substance, or material as a controlled substance, alcoholic beverage, or intoxicant.
  - c Unlawfully possessed or unlawfully offered, arranged, or negotiated to sell drug paraphernalia, as defined in Section 11014.5 of the Health and Safety Code.
  - d Unlawfully offered, arranged to sell, negotiated to sell, or sold the prescription drug SOMA.
- 2. Students who violate the prohibitions in this policy may be referred to law enforcement based upon the fact that some infractions violate local or state law. Any action taken by law enforcement will be in addition to the actions taken by the District.
- 3. A student may be suspended or expelled for any act identified in sub paragraph B.1 (a) (d) of this policy document related to school activity or attendance which occurs at any time, including, but not limited to, any of the following:

- a. While on school grounds.
- b. While going to or coming from school.
- c. During the lunch period whether on or off the campus.
- d. During, or while going or coming from, a school sponsored activity.
- 4. In accordance with Education Code section 48915(c), the Principal. Superintendent or their designees shall immediately suspend and shall recommend expulsion of any student who unlawfully sold any controlled substance (listed in Health And Safety Code section 11053 *et seq.*) at school or at a school activity off school grounds as defined in sub paragraph B.1 (a)- (d).
- In accordance with Education Code section 48915(a), the Principal or the Superintendent shall recommend the expulsion of any student who unlawfully possesses any controlled substance (listed in Health And Safety Code section 11053 et seq.) at school or at a school activity off school grounds as defined in sub paragraph B.3. (a)-(d) immediately above, unless the Principal or Superintendent finds that expulsion is inappropriate due to the particular circumstance. The Principal or Superintendent shall recommend expulsion in such cases if: (1) other means of correction are not feasible or have repeatedly failed to bring about proper conduct; and/or (2) due to the nature of the act, the presence of the student causes a continuing danger to the physical safety of the student or others.

# C. FIRST OFFENSE FOR VIOLATION OF THIS POLICY BY STUDENTS ENROLLED IN GRADES SIX THROUGH TWELVE WHEN EXPULSION IS <u>NOT</u> RECOMMENDED AND IS NOT REQUIRED BY LAW.

- 1. For a first offense in violation of subparagraph B.1 (a) (d), a student may be suspended for a period of five (5) school days either out-of-school or in-house as determined by the site administrator or designee. Additionally, student suspended for a first offense violation shall be assigned 20 hours of community service over and above hours required for graduation.
- 2. The student and his/her parents or guardians will be invited to a meeting with the site Principal or designee to discuss this policy and Board Policy 5014, and the consequences of the student's actions. The student and his/ her parents/guardians will be referred to community services and encouraged to seek counseling services that address student and family needs. The Principal or designee also shall explain the function of the Readmission Committee and its procedures as set forth in sub paragraph D of this policy document.
  - Prior to suspension, a conference between the student and whenever practicable, the school employee who referred the student, shall be conducted by the Principal or principal's designee unless there is a clear and present danger to the lives, safety or health of students or school personnel.
- 3. During the period of suspension, all teachers will be expected to provide makeup coursework upon the student's return to school. As practicable, independent study and/or reading assignments may be provided during the period of suspension.
- 4. During the period of suspension from school, the student shall not participate in any extra curricular or co-curricular activity. Further, students shall be ineligible to participate in extra curricular or co-curricular activities for 20 school days upon returning to school from school suspension for violation of this policy.
- 5. Students participating in extra curricular activities where academic credit is given shall be provided an alternative graded activity to earn such credit if suspended from the activity for a violation of this policy under number 4 above.

# D. READMISSION COMMITTEE

In order to increase the potential that early intervention efforts will be successful, the Superintendent shall establish a Readmission Committee (Committee). The Committee shall be composed of District certificated administrators who will meet with the parent/guardian and student to discuss a transition plan back into the school program as well as conditions placed upon the student for readmission privileges. For students suspended for a first offense which does not carry with it an expulsion recommendation, under this policy, the Committee has the authority to reduce a suspension of four (4) or five (5) days to three (3) days based on the all of the circumstances if the student and parent/guardian are willing to enter into a written agreement. In such agreement, the student shall acknowledge the commission of the misconduct and the seriousness of the misconduct, promise not to engage in prohibited drug/alcohol misconduct or any other misconduct in the future, to participate in specified activities designed to help prevent a second offense, and other reasonable terms and conditions recommended by the Committee. In no case does the Committee have the authority to extend the suspension beyond five (5) days, or to recommend expulsion or hear appeals. Meeting with the Committee is voluntary, and a parent/guardian may choose not to meet with the Committee.

# E. SECOND OFFENSE FOR VIOLATION OF THIS POLICY BY STUDENTS ENROLLED IN GRADES SIX THROUGH TWELVE WHEN EXPULSION IS RECOMMENDED OR REQUIRED BY LAW.

Where expulsion is recommended or required by law, a student shall be suspended from school for up to five (5) days in accordance with law. (See also Board Policy 5014 – Student Discipline: Suspension and Expulsion.)

# F. ADDITIONAL CONSEQUENCES FOR A VIOLATION DURING ANY FIELD TRIP OR PARTICIPATION IN ANY EXTRA OR CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITY.

While participating in any field trip or extra or co-curricular activity, a student who violates any prohibition in this policy will be sent home as soon as possible at the expense of the parents or legal guardians.

### G. NOTIFICATION OF POLICY.

Students, parents and legal guardians at least annually shall be notified of this policy. The Superintendent shall establish additional means to assure that students and parents/guardians also are notified of the long term serious adverse effects on a student's future of violating this policy.
