## Reopening Survey Update

Board of Education Meeting July 31, 2020

### Board Action - July 27, 2020

- Investigate what the waiver for elementary schools entails and implement distance learning for elementary schools at this time.
- 2. Accept implementation of Phase I distance learning for secondary schools for the first trimester through mid-November, and add a virtual academy with an option equivalent to an LBUSD six class model.

### **Recap: Elementary Options**

### 1. LBUSD Virtual Academy, 100% online

• If the District is permitted to reopen elementary schools, families will have the option to transition into Option 2 at the end of a trimester, as space permits.

### 2. 4 Day Flipped Instruction model

- Students attend in-person four days per week
- Two days of direct teacher instruction in small classes
- Two days of enrichment, intervention, and encore classes
- Asynchronous distance learning on Fridays
- This model is currently offered via full distance learning only until Orange County is permitted to reopen schools in accordance with CDPH and OCHCA guidelines

### **Option 1: LBUSD Virtual Academy - Elementary**

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<u>Synchronous Learning</u>: Students are assigned to a 90-minute live online learning with a teacher and up to 10 other students for daily direct instruction, small group support, and individual goal-setting. Teachers support and facilitate learning primarily through an online curriculum program.

<u>Asynchronous Learning</u>: When not participating in the 90-minute live online instruction block, students work independently on their core academic classes using an online program that is personalized and differentiated for each student.

#### Lunch

<u>Additional Support</u>: Scheduled time for additional intervention, special education services, and individual conferences. (Special Education service may also occur in the morning blocks.)


<u>Asynchronous Learning</u>: Students work independently on their core academic classes using an online program, activities, and materials that are personalized and differentiated for each student.





# Recap: Secondary Options (as of July 27 Board Action)

### Option 1: 100% Virtual Academy with Six Courses

- Full year commitment to distance learning
- The extent of live teaching provided by LBUSD teachers depends on the enrollment in Option 1
- If this model cannot be taught directly by LBUSD staff due to low enrollment, curriculum will be delivered in an online platform, such as Apex or UC Scout, and daily support will be provided by LBUSD teachers
- This option cannot be provided in-person due to the District's inability to cohort students and implement health and safety guidelines as required by CA Dept of Public Health.

### **Option 2: Trimester Hybrid Model**

- Students attend two days per week in-person (once permitted to return)
- Students take two courses at a time in person/six courses over the whole year
- Option for students to take additional course(s) online
- Asynchronous distance learning on Fridays
- This model is currently offered via full distance learning only until Orange County is permitted to reopen schools in accordance with CDPH and OCHCA guidelines
- Families who select this option will have the choice to remain in distance learning only, within the trimester model, once schools are permitted to reopen.
- CDPH states, "a cohort is a stable group with fixed membership that stays together for all courses and activities (e.g., lunch, recess, etc.) and avoids contact with other persons or cohorts."




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
