


School districts receive funding from different sources: state funds under the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), other state funds, local funds, and federal funds. LCFF funds include a base level of funding for all LEAs and extra funding - called "supplemental and concentration" grants - to LEAs based on the enrollment (high needs students (foster youth, English learners, and low-income students).



This chart shows the total general purpose revenue Laguna Beach Unified School District expects to receive the coming year from all sources.

The total revenue projected for Laguna Beach Unified School District is \$69,214,477.00, of which \$60,314,454.00 is Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) funds, \$4,132,372.00 is other state funds, \$2,628,539.00 is local funds, and \$2,139,112.00 is federal funds. Of the \$2,139,112.00 in federal funds, \$1,188,970.00 are federal CARES Act funds. Of the \$60,314,454.00 in LCFF Funds, \$598,932.00 is generate based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learner, and low-income students).

For the 2020-21 school year school districts must work with parents, educators, students, and the community develop a Learning Continuity and Attendance Plan (Learning Continuity Plan). The Learning Continuity Pla replaces the Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) for the 2020–21 school year and provides school districts with the opportunity to desribe how they are planning to provide a high-quality education, social-emotional supports, and nutrition to their students during the COVID-19 pandemic.



This chart provides a quick summary of how much Laguna Beach Unified School District plans to spend for planned actions and services in the Learning Continuity Plan for 2020-2021 and how much of the total is tied increasing or improving services for high needs students.


Laguna Beach Unified School District plans to spend \$69,214,477.00 for the 2020-2021 school year. Of that amount, \$2,666,073.00 is tied to actions/services in the Learning Continuity Plan and \$66,548,404.00 is not included in the Learning Continuity Plan. The budgeted expenditures that are not included in the Learning Continuity Plan will be used for the following:

LEAs are required to record expenditures according to the types of items purchased or services obtained. Th General Fund is the chief operating fund for the Laguna Beach Unified School District and is divided into restricted and unrestricted segments. Approximately 73% of the total General Fund expenditure budget consists of salaries and benefits. In addition to these costs, the district carries out a vast array of educational support activities such as administration, transportation, nutrition services, custodial activities, health and safety, building maintenance and operation, and more. These support activities along with the related suppli and operating costs do not directly influence the outcome of the actions and services identified in the Learnin Continuity Plan. For this reason, they are not included in the LCP.

Increased or Improved Services for High Needs Students in in the Learning Continuity Plan fitter the 2020-2021 School Year

In 2020-2021, Laguna Beach Unified School District is projecting it will receive \$598,932.00 based on the enrollment of foster youth, English learner, and low-income students. Laguna Beach Unified School District must describe how it intends to increase or improve services for high needs students in the Learning Continu Plan. Laguna Beach Unified School District plans to spend \$698,766.00 towards meeting this requirement, a described in the Learning Continuity Plan.

#### Update on Increased or Improved Services for High Needs Students in 2019-2020



This chart compares what Laguna Beach Unified School District budgeted in the 2019-20 LCAP for actions a services that contributed to increasing or improving services for high needs students with what Laguna Beach Unified School District actually spent on actions and services that contributed to increasing or improving services for high needs students in the 2019-20 school year.

In 2019-2020, Laguna Beach Unified School District's LCAP budgeted \$1,003,721.00 for planned actions to increase or improve services for high needs students. Laguna Beach Unified School District actually spent \$936,454.00 for actions to increase or improve services for high needs students in 2019-2020. The difference between the budgeted and actual expenditures of \$67,267.00 had the following impact on Laguna Beach Unified School District's ability to increase or improve services for high needs students:

Due to the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic, the operations at the District were dramatically altered. The school closures disrupted student services and led to the transition to distance learning.
