Update on Audio/Visual Recording Equipment for the Boardroom and Closed Captioning Requirements for Live Streaming During Board Meetings

The Board of Education received the update on the audiovisual equipment in the boardroom from Mr. Mike Morrison and the closed captioning requirements for live streaming from Dr. Viloria and Mrs. Webber. Staff sought direction from the Board on the next steps.

### **Proposal**

Staff proposes the Board of Education approve a three-year annually renewable contract with Vavrinek, Trine, Day & Co., LLP (VTD) to perform district annual auditing services for fiscal years 2019-2020 with a not-to-exceed amount of \$38,000; 2020-2021 with a not-to-exceed amount of \$38,700; and 2021-2022 with a not-to-exceed amount of \$39,500.

### **Background**

Education Code 40120 requires that each school district shall provide for an annual audit of the books and accounts of the school district.

Pursuant to Government Code Section 53060 the audit firm selection process does not require a district go to bid. Per Education Code 40102, we are required to select and sign an agreement for our fiscal year 2019-2020 annual audit and submit it to the Orange County Office of Education (OCDE) by April 1, 2020. If we do not meet this deadline, OCDE is required to provide an audit selection for us no later than May 1, 2020.

With the passage of AB2834 and in accordance with Education Code 41020 (f) (2), "it is unlawful for a public accounting firm to provide the audit services to a local educational agency if the lead audit partner, or coordinating partner responsible for reviewing the audit has performed audit services for the local educational agency in each of the six previous fiscal years." It is the policy of VTD to change the lead audit partner at a maximum of six years to change member of the field audit staff on an annual basis.

OCDE strongly recommends selection of an audit firm familiar with the audit requirements of California K-12 school districts. VTD has provided auditing services to school districts, community college districts and county offices since 1948.

VTD has performed information regarding their firm's review by Watson Coon Ryan, LLC., of their system of quality control for the accounting and auditing practice. Their reputation for quality of performance and integrity is excellent throughout the state and VTD is deemed qualified by the State Controller to conduct audits of local education agencies.

# **Budget Impact**

The maximum annual fee for auditing services for fiscal year 2019-2020 shall not exceed \$38,000. This amount will be included in next year's General Fund budget.

### **Recommended Action**

Staff recommends the Board of Education approve a three-year annually renewable contract with Vavrinek, Trine, Day & Co., LLP (VTD) to perform district annual auditing services for fiscal years 2019-2020 with a not-to-exceed amount of \$38,000; 2020-2021 with a not-to-exceed amount of \$38,700; and 2021-2022 with a not-to-exceed amount of \$39,500.

### **CONTRACT FOR AUDITING**

This agreement made and entered into this \_\_\_\_\_ of \_\_\_\_\_\_\_, 2019, between the Governing Board of the Laguna Beach Unified School District, of Orange County, State of California, hereafter referred to as "District" and VAVRINEK, TRINE, DAY & CO., LLP, Certified Public Accountants, hereafter referred to as "Auditors".

We understand the services we are to provide the District for the June 30, 2020, 2021, and 2022, respectively. We will audit the financial statements, including the related notes to the financial statements, which collectively comprise the basic financial statements, financial statements of the District, as of and for the threeyear period beginning July 1, 2019 and ending June 30, 2022. Accounting standards generally accepted in the United States provide for certain required supplementary information (RSI), such as management's discussion and analysis (MD&A) to supplement the District's basic financial statements. Such information, although not a part of the basic financial statements, is required by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board who considers it to be an essential part of financial reporting for placing the basic financial statements in an appropriate operational, economic, or historical context. As part of our engagement, we will apply certain limited procedures to District's RSI in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. These limited procedures will consist of inquiries of management regarding the methods of preparing the information and comparing the information for consistency with management's responses to our inquiries, the basic financial statements, and other knowledge we obtained during our audit of the basic financial statements. We will not express an opinion or provide any assurance on the information because the limited procedures do not provide us with sufficient evidence to express an opinion or provide any assurance. The following RSI is required by generally accepted accounting principles and will be subjected to certain limited procedures, but will not be audited:

- 1. Management's Discussion and Analysis.
- 2. Budgetary Comparison Schedules.
- 3. Schedule of Changes in the District's Net OPEB Liability and Related Ratios
- 4. Schedule of the District's Proportionate Share of the Net Pension Liability.
- 5. Schedule of District Contributions for Pension.
- 6. Notes to RSI

Supplementary information other than RSI, also accompanies District's basic financial statements. We will subject the following supplementary information to the auditing procedures applied in our audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and will provide an opinion on it in relation to the financial statements as a whole:

- 1. Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards.
- 2. Schedules required by the current Guide for Annual Audits of K-12 Local Education Agencies and State Compliance Reporting, issued by the Education Audit Appeals Panel.
- 3. Combining Statements Non-Major Governmental Funds

Our responsibility for other information included in documents containing Laguna Beach Unified School District's audited financial statements and auditor's report does not extend beyond the financial information identified in the report. We have no responsibility for determining whether such other information contained in these documents is properly stated.

#### **AUDIT OBJECTIVES**

The objective of our audit is the expression of an opinion as to whether your basic financial statements are fairly presented, in all material respects, in conformity with United States generally accepted accounting principles and to report on the fairness of the supplementary information referred to above when considered in relation to the financial statements taken as a whole. The objective also includes reporting on:

- Internal control over financial reporting and compliance with provisions of laws, regulations, contracts, and award agreements, noncompliance with which could have a material effect on the financial statements in accordance with *Government Auditing Standards*.
- Internal control over compliance related to major programs and an opinion (or disclaimer of opinion) on compliance with Federal statutes, regulations, and the terms and conditions of Federal awards that could have a direct and material effect on each major program in accordance with the Single Audit Act Amendments of 1996 and Title 2 U.S. Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Part 200, Uniform Administrative Requirements, Costs Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards (Uniform Guidance).

The Government Auditing Standards report on internal control over financial reporting and compliance will each include a paragraph that states that that (1) the purpose of the report is solely to describe the scope of testing of internal control and compliance and the results of that testing and not to provide an opinion on the effectiveness of internal control over financial reporting or on compliance, and (2) the report is an integral part of an audit performed in accordance with Government Auditing Standards in considering the entity's internal control and compliance. The Uniform Guidance report on internal control over compliance will include a paragraph that states that the purpose of the report on internal control over compliance is solely to describe the scope of testing of internal control over compliance and the results of that testing based on the requirements of the Uniform Guidance. Both reports will state that the report is not suitable for any other purpose.

Our audit will be conducted in accordance with United States generally accepted auditing standards; the standards outlined in the current *Guide for Annual Audits of K-12 Local Education Agencies and State Compliance Reporting*, the standards for financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards*, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States; the Single Audit Act Amendments of 1996; and the provisions of Uniform Guidance, and will include tests of accounting records, a determination of major program(s) in accordance with Uniform Guidance, and other procedures we consider necessary to enable us to express such opinions, We will issue written reports upon completion of our single audit. If our opinion on the financial statements or the Single Audit compliance opinion is other than unmodified, we will fully discuss the reasons with you in advance. We cannot provide assurance that unmodified opinions will be expressed. Circumstances may arise in which it is necessary for us to modify our opinions or add emphasis-of-matter or other-matter paragraphs. If our opinions on the financial statements or the single audit compliance opinions are other than unmodified, we will discuss the reasons with you in advance.

We cannot provide assurance that unmodified opinions will be expressed. Circumstances may arise in which it is necessary for us to modify our opinions or add emphasis-of-matter or other-matter paragraphs. If our opinions are other than unmodified, we will discuss the reasons with you in advance. If, for any reason, we are unable to complete the audit or are unable to form or have not formed opinions, we may decline to express opinions or issue reports, or we may withdraw from this engagement.

If circumstances occur related to the condition of your records, the availability of sufficient, appropriate audit evidence, or the existence of a significant risk of material misstatement of the financial statements caused by error, fraudulent financial reporting, or misappropriation of assets, which in our professional judgment prevent us from completing the audit or forming an opinion on the financial statements, we retain the right to take any course of action permitted by professional standards, including declining to express an opinion or issue a report, or withdrawing from the engagement.

#### **AUDIT PROCEDURES - GENERAL**

An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the Financial Statements; therefore, our audit will involve judgment about the number of transactions to be examined and the areas to be tested. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the Financial Statements. We will plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the Financial Statements are free of material misstatement, whether from: (1) errors; (2) fraudulent financial reporting; (3) misappropriation of assets; or (4) violations of laws or governmental regulations that are attributable to Laguna Beach Unified School District or to acts by management or employees acting on behalf of Laguna Beach Unified School District. Because the determination of abuse is subjective, Government Auditing Standards do not expect auditors to provide reasonable assurance of detecting abuse.

Because of the inherent limitations of an audit, combined with the inherent limitations of internal control, and because we will not perform a detailed examination of all transactions, there is a risk that material misstatements or noncompliance may exist and not be detected by us, even though the audit is properly planned and performed in accordance with United States generally accepted auditing standards and Government Auditing Standards. In addition, an audit is not designed to detect immaterial misstatements or violations of laws or governmental regulations that do not have a direct and material effect on the Financial Statements or major programs. Our procedures will include tests of documentary evidence supporting the transactions recorded in the accounts, and may include tests of the physical existence of inventories and direct confirmation of receivables and certain other assets and liabilities by correspondence with selected individuals, funding sources, creditors, and financial institutions. We will request written representations from your attorneys as part of the engagement, and they may bill you for responding to this inquiry. At the conclusion of our audit, we will require certain written representations from you about your responsibilities for the Financial Statements; Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards; federal award programs; compliance with laws, regulations, contracts, and grant agreements; and other responsibilities required by generally accepted auditing standards.

#### **AUDIT PROCEDURES - INTERNAL CONTROL**

Our audit will include obtaining an understanding of Laguna Beach Unified School District and its environment, including internal control, sufficient to assess the risks of material misstatement of the Financial Statements and to design the nature, timing, and extent of further audit procedures. Tests of controls may be performed to test the effectiveness of certain controls that we consider relevant to preventing and detecting errors and fraud that are material to the Financial Statements and to preventing and detecting misstatements resulting from illegal acts and other noncompliance matters that have a direct and material effect on the Financial Statements. Our tests, if performed, will be less in scope than would be necessary to render an opinion on internal control and, accordingly, no opinion will be expressed in our report on internal control issued pursuant to Government Auditing Standards.

As required by the Uniform Guidance, we will perform tests of controls over compliance to evaluate the effectiveness of the design and operation of controls that we consider relevant to preventing or detecting material noncompliance with compliance requirements applicable to each major federal award program. However, our tests will be less in scope than would be necessary to render an opinion on those controls and, accordingly, no opinion will be expressed in our report on internal control issued pursuant to the Uniform Guidance.

An audit is not designed to provide assurance on internal control or to identify significant deficiencies or material weaknesses. However, during the audit, we will communicate to management and those charged with governance internal control related matters that are required to be communicated under AICPA professional standards, Government Auditing Standards, and the Uniform Guidance.

#### **AUDIT PROCEDURES - COMPLIANCE**

As part of obtaining reasonable assurance about whether the Financial Statements are free of material misstatement, we will perform tests of Laguna Beach Unified School District's compliance with provisions of applicable laws, regulations, contracts, and agreements, including grant agreements. However, the objective of those procedures will not be to provide an opinion on overall compliance, and we will not express such an opinion in our report on compliance issued pursuant to Government Auditing Standards.

The Uniform Guidance requires that we also plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the auditee has complied with federal statutes, regulations, and the terms and conditions of federal awards applicable to major programs. Our procedures will consist of tests of transactions and other applicable procedures described in the OMB Compliance Supplement for the types of compliance requirements that could have a direct and material effect on each of Laguna Beach Unified School District's major programs. The purpose of these procedures will be to express an opinion on Laguna Beach Unified School District's compliance with requirements applicable to each of its major programs in our report on compliance issued pursuant to the Uniform Guidance.

#### **OTHER SERVICES**

We will also assist in preparing the Financial Statements, Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards, and related notes of Laguna Beach Unified School District in conformity with United States GAAP and the Uniform Guidance based on information provided by you. These nonaudit services do not constitute an audit under Government Auditing Standards, and such services will not be conducted in accordance with Government Auditing Standards. We will perform the services in accordance with applicable professional standards. The other services are limited to the Financial Statements, Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards, and related notes previously defined. We, in our sole professional judgment, reserve the right to refuse to perform any procedure or take any action that could be construed as assuming management responsibilities.

#### **MANAGEMENT RESPONSIBILITIES**

Management is responsible for: (1) designing, implementing, and maintaining effective internal controls, including internal controls over federal awards, and for evaluating and monitoring ongoing activities, to help ensure that appropriate goals and objectives are met; (2) following laws and regulations; (3) ensuring that there is reasonable assurance that government programs are administered in compliance with compliance requirements; and (4) ensuring that management and financial information is reliable and properly reported. Management is also responsible for implementing systems designed to achieve compliance with applicable laws, regulations, contracts, and grant agreements. Management is also responsible for making all financial records and related information available to us and for the accuracy and completeness of that information. You are also responsible for providing us with (1) access to all information of which you are aware that is relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of the Financial Statements, (2) access to personnel, accounts, books, records, supporting documentation, and other information as needed to perform an audit under the Uniform Guidance, (3) additional information that we may request for the purpose of the audit, and (4) unrestricted access to persons within Laguna Beach Unified School District from whom we determine it necessary to obtain audit evidence.

Further, you agree to oversee the nonaudit services by designating an individual, preferably from senior management, with suitable skill, knowledge, or experience; evaluate the adequacy and results of those services; and accept responsibility for them.

Your responsibilities also include identifying significant vendor relationships in which the vendor has responsibility for program compliance and for the accuracy and completeness of that information. Your responsibilities include adjusting the financial statements to correct material misstatements and confirming to us in the written management representation letter that the effects of any uncorrected misstatements aggregated by us during the current engagement and pertaining to the latest period presented are immaterial, both individually and in the aggregate, to the financial statements taken as a whole.

Authorization to Renew License to Use Agreement with Orin Neufeld to Operate a Youth Recreation Facility at 2003 Laguna Canyon Road for the 2019-2020 School Year

## **Proposal**

Staff proposes the Board of Education authorize the renewal of the License to Use Agreement with Orin Neufeld to operate a youth recreation facility at 2003 Laguna Canyon Road for the 2019-2020 school year.

## **Background**

The terms of this License to Use Agreement allow for annual renewal if both parties are in mutual agreement.

## **Budget Impact**

Approval of the proposed use agreement would result in a gross income to the District of \$16,000 for one full year.

## **Agreement Components**

**Premises**: LICENSOR agrees to allow LICENSEE to use the premises situated in the City of Laguna Beach, County of Orange, State of California, hereinafter referred to as Premises, and more particularly described as 2003 Laguna Canyon Road. LICENSOR agrees that LICENSEE shall have exclusive use of the rear portion of the PREMISES and joint use of office, restrooms, sidewalks and parking lots.

**Term:** The term of this Agreement shall commence on July 1, 2019, and terminate on June 30, 2020, subject to earlier termination as set forth herein. This AGREEMENT may be renewed for subsequent one (1) year terms upon mutual written agreement of the PARTIES. Neither Mr. Neufeld nor his supporters will contest termination of this USE AGREEMENT if the Board of Education deems it has determined a better use for the property.

License Fees: LICENSEE shall pay LICENSOR a license to use fee in the sum of sixteen hundred dollars (\$1,600) per month (\$16,000 total). LICENSEE shall pay

LICENSOR this fee amount on the 1<sup>st</sup> of every month throughout the duration of the term. All of said fees shall be paid to: Laguna Beach Unified School District, 550 Blumont Street, Laguna Beach, California 92651, or at such other place as LICENSOR may designate in writing. In the event of any renewal of this AGREEMENT, the amount of the annual fees may be adjusted to reflect a cost of living adjustment each subsequent January 1<sup>st</sup>. The adjustment shall be calculated upon the basis of the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics, Consumer Price Index Sub-Group – "All Items" for the Los Angeles, Anaheim, Riverside Western area published for the month of May of each year. LICENSEE shall not pay any license fees for the months of July and August 2019 due to decreased activity for youth sports.

#### **Recommended Action**

Staff recommends the Board of Education approve the renewal of the License to Use Agreement with Orin Neufeld to operate a youth recreation facility at 2003 Laguna Canyon Road for the 2018-2019 school year.

#### LICENSE TO USE AGREEMENT

This LICENSE TO USE Agreement, hereinafter referred to as AGREEMENT, for reference purpose only, is entered into this 1st day of July, 2019, by and between the Laguna Beach Unified School District, 550 Blumont Street, Laguna Beach, California 92651, hereinafter referred to as LICENSOR and Orin Neufeld at 1205 Victory Walk, Laguna Beach, CA 92651, Phone: 949-494-5287, hereinafter referred to as LICENSEE. LICENSOR and LICENSEE shall be collectively referred to as the PARTIES.

#### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, LICENSEE desires to use certain premises, as hereinafter defined, to LICENSOR; and

WHEREAS, LICENSE desires to use the premises of LICENSOR for the purpose of operating a Youth Recreation Facility at 2003 Laguna Canyon Road,

NOW, THEREFORE, the PARTIES agree as follows:

- 1.0 <u>PREMISES</u>. LICENSOR agrees to allow LICENSEE and LICENSEE agrees to use, the premises situated in the City of Laguna Beach, County of Orange, State of California, hereinafter referred to as Premises, and described as 2003 Laguna Canyon Road at the rear of LICENSOR'S property. LICENSOR agrees that LICENSEE shall have exclusive use of the rear portion of the property of Premises and joint use of office, restrooms, sidewalks and parking lots.
- 2.0 <u>TERM</u>. The term of this AGREEMENT shall commence on July 1, 2019, and terminate on June 30, 2020, subject to termination as set forth in this AGREEMENT. Neither Mr. Neufeld nor his supporters will contest termination of this AGREEMENT if the Board of Education deems it has determined a better use for the property.

#### 3.0 LICENSE FEES.

- A. LICENSEE shall pay LICENSOR a license to use fee in the sum of **Sixteen Hundred Dollars (\$1600) per month.** LICENSEE shall pay LICENSOR this fee amount on the first day of every month throughout the duration of the AGREEMENT term. All of said fees shall be paid to: Laguna Beach Unified School District, 550 Blumont Street, Laguna Beach, California 92651, or at such other place as LICENSOR may designate in writing.
- B. In the event of any renewal of this AGREEMENT, the amount of the annual fees may be adjusted to reflect a cost of living adjustment each subsequent January 1<sup>st</sup>. The adjustment shall be calculated upon the basis of the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics, Consumer Price Index Sub-Group "All Items" for the Los Angeles, Anaheim, Riverside Western area published for the month of May of each year.

- C. LICENSEE shall not pay any license fees for the months of July and August, 2018 due to decreased activity for youth sports.
- 4.0 CUSTODIAL SERVICES. No custodial services will be provided by LICENSOR.
- 5.0 <u>USE.</u> The Premises shall be used for the LICENSEE'S **Youth Recreation Facility as described in the City of Laguna Beach's Conditional Use Permit** and for no other purposes without the prior written consent of LICENSOR. LICENSEE shall not commit, or permit to be committed, any waste or nuisance upon the Premises. LICENSEE shall not use the Premises, or any part thereof, for any purpose other than the purpose for which said premises are to be used. LICENSEE shall, at LICENSOR'S sole cost and expense, observe and use the Premises in compliance with all municipal, county, state and federal regulations, ordinances and statutes now in force, or which may hereafter be in force.
- 6.0 <u>EQUIPMENT</u>. LICENSEE may install and operate equipment that is normal for the purposes for which the LICENSEE is using the Premises. LICENSEE shall remove such equipment from the Premises upon or prior to the termination of the AGREEMENT and repair any damage to the Premises caused by such removal.
- 7.0 <u>COMPLIANCE</u>. LICENSOR warrants to LICENSEE that the Premises to be occupied by LICENSEE does not violate any covenants or restrictions of record, and is in compliance with all applicable statutes, codes, regulations and ordinances.
- 8.0 <u>MAINTENANCE & GROUNDS.</u> LICENSEE shall, at LICENSOR'S sole cost and expense, maintain the landscaping and the entire Premises including but not limited to any of LICENSEE'S equipment installed on the Premises.
- 9.0 <u>ALTERATIONS</u>. LICENSEE shall pay all costs of any alterations or additions to the Premises. LICENSEE shall not make, or permit to be made, any additions or alterations of the Premises, or any part thereof, without the written consent of LICENSOR. LICENSOR may retain the right to specific additions if such written agreement with LICENSOR is gained prior to installation. LICENSEE shall indemnify LICENSOR against, and hold LICENSOR harmless from, any and all mechanics' liens or claims of liens and all attorney's fees, costs and expenses which may accrue, arise out of, or be incurred by reason of or on account of any such lien or claims of lien. LICENSOR shall at all times have the right to post and to keep posted on the Premises such notices provided for under or by virtue of the laws of the State of California for the protection of the Premises from mechanics liens or liens of a similar nature.

#### 10.0 INDEMNIFICATION/INSURANCE.

A. To the extent authorized by law, and except for the acts or omissions of LICENSOR, its employees, agents and officers, LICENSEE hereby agrees to hold harmless, indemnify and defend LICENSOR, and its Governing Board, officers, agents and employees from any liability

or any claims of liability for bodily injury, personal injury, sickness, disease or death of any person or persons, or damage to property, real, personal, tangible or intangible, arising out of the use of the Premises for LICENSEE'S operations during the term of this AGREEMENT. In this respect, LICENSEE agrees to carry a comprehensive general liability insurance policy including premises operations, products completed operations, blanket contractual and personal injury with limits of One million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence, combined single limit in a form mutually acceptable to both parties to protect LICENSEE and LICENSOR against liability or claims of liability arising out of the use of the Premises for LICENSEE'S operations during the term of this AGREEMENT. LICENSEE agrees to secure a specific endorsement to its liability policy stating, "Such insurance as is afforded for LICENSOR and its Governing Board, officers, agents, and employees shall be primary, and any insurance carried by LICENSOR, its Governing Board, officers, agents and employees shall be excess and noncontributory." In addition, LICENSEE agrees to name the Laguna Beach Unified School District, and its Governing Board, officers, agents, and employees as additional insureds under the policy and shall furnish LICENSOR with a certificate of insurance evidencing all coverages and endorsements required herein including a thirty (30) day written notice of cancellation or reduction in coverage.

B. To the extent authorized by law, and except for the acts or omissions of members, employees, agents, and officers of LICENSEE, LICENSOR hereby agrees to hold harmless, indemnify and defend LICENSEE and their officers, agents and employees, from any liability or any claims of liability for bodily injury, personal injury, sickness, disease or death of any person or persons, or damage to property, real, personal, tangible or intangible, arising out of the use of the Premises for operations other than those of LICENSEE during the term of this AGREEMENT. In this respect, LICENSOR agrees to carry a comprehensive general liability insurance policy including premises operations, products completed operations, blanket contractual and personal injury with limits of One million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence, combined single limit in a form mutually acceptable to both parties to protect LICENSOR and LICENSEE against liability or claims of liability arising out of the use of the Premises for operations other than those of LICENSEE during the term of this AGREEMENT. LICENSOR shall furnish LICENSEE with a certificate of insurance evidencing all coverages and endorsements required hereunder including a thirty (30) day written notice of cancellation or reduction in coverage.

11.0 <u>DESTRUCTION</u>. In the event of partial destruction of the Premises during the Term, LICENSOR shall forthwith repair the same, provided such repairs can be made within ninety (90) days of the destruction, but such partial destruction shall not affect this AGREEMENT,

- except that LICENSEE shall be entitled to a daily pro rata reduction of fees while such repairs are being made, based upon the extent to which the destruction or the making of such repairs interferes with the business carried on by LICENSEE upon the Premises, but in no event to be more than the amount of the monthly rental. In the event that LICENSOR is unable to make such repairs within sixty (60) days of destruction, this AGREEMENT may be terminated by notice in writing by either PARTY. A total destruction of the Premises shall automatically terminate this AGREEMENT.
- 12.0 <u>RIGHT OF ENTRY</u>. LICENSEE shall permit LICENSOR and its officers, employees or agents to enter upon the Premises during business hours for the purpose of inspecting the same, except in the case of emergency in which case no notice shall be required. LICENSOR may enter upon the Premises during business hours upon the giving of twentyfour (24) hours' prior notice or at such time as is agreeable between the Parties for making any alterations, repairs, improvements or additions to any portion the Premises as LICENSOR may see fit to make.
- 13.0 ASSIGNMENT AND SUBUSE. LICENSEE shall not assign this AGREEMENT, or any interest therein, and shall not sub-use or sublet the Premises, or any part thereof, or any right or privilege appurtenant thereto, without the prior written consent of LICENSOR. A consent to one assignment or subletting shall not be construed as a consent to any subsequent assignment or subletting unless such written consent has been given and obtained. Any assignment or sub-use of this AGREEMENT, or of any interest therein, either by voluntary or involuntary act of LICENSEE, or by operation of law, or otherwise, may be deemed a breach of this AGREEMENT by LICENSEE at LICENSOR'S election, and any such purported assignment or sub-using without such consent, may be deemed by LICENSOR to be null and void. LICENSOR'S consent to any such assignment or sub-using shall not relieve LICENSEE from any obligations under this AGREEMENT.
- 14.0 <u>SIGNS</u>. No sign, advertisement or notice shall be inscribed, painted, or affixed to or on any part of the Premises without LICENSOR'S prior written consent as to size, location, style, design, and type.
- 15.0 <u>HOLDING OVER</u>. Holding over after the expiration of the AGREEMENT term, or any oral extension thereof with the consent of LICENSOR, shall be a tenancy from month to month at a monthly rate of 110% of the last month's fees. All other conditions and agreements of this AGREEMENT shall be applicable to such holding over.
- 16.0 QUIET POSSESSION. So long as LICENSEE performs its obligations under this AGREEMENT, LICENSEE shall have quiet and peaceful possession of the Premises for the term of the AGREEMENT.

17.0 OPTION TO RENEW. Failing Board of Education determination of another use of the Premises, LICENSEE shall have the option to renew this AGREEMENT for a further period of one (1) year, after the expiration of the the previous term, under the same terms and conditions except that the fee rate may be adjusted based on a cost of living increase. The adjustment shall be calculated upon the basis of the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics, Consumer Price Index Sub-Group – "All Items" for the Los Angeles, Anaheim, Riverside Western area published for the month of May of each year. In no instance shall the increase exceed six percent (6%) any one year unless the entire AGREEMENT is renegotiated. 18.0 TERMINATION. LICENSEE or LICENSOR may terminate this AGREEMENT at any time for any reason by giving written notice to the other party ninety (90) days in advance of the desired date of termination. Upon termination, LICENSEE shall surrender the Premises to LICENSOR in the same condition as when received, ordinary wear and tear excepted. LICENSEE shall repair any damage to the Premises occasioned by removal of its trade fixtures, furnishings and equipment, prior to the expiration or sooner termination of the AGREEMENT. If LICENSOR defaults in the performance of any 19.0 DEFAULT BY LICENSOR. agreement or condition required by this AGREEMENT to be performed by LICENSOR, and such default continues for a period of thirty (30) days after written notice has been given by LICENSEE specifying the default, unless default, by necessity, will require more than thirty (30) days to cure and LICENSOR has commenced actions necessary to cure that default within said thirty (30) day period and is diligently pursuing the same to completion, then LICENSEE may declare a breach of this AGREEMENT by written notice to LICENSORE and exercise any one or more of the rights available to a licensee under the laws of the State of California, including without limitation, the right to terminate this AGREEMENT immediately and without further notice to LICENSOR, and to seek such equitable or other relief as may be available to LICENSEE by law.

20.0 <u>DEFAULT BY LICENSEE</u>. If (i) LICENSEE defaults in the payment of fees or the payment of any monetary amount required by this AGREEMENT (collectively, a "Monetary Default") and such Monetary Default continues for period of thirty (30) days after written notice has been given by LICENSORE to LICENSEE specifying the Monetary Default; or (ii) LICENSEE defaults in the performance of any other condition required by this AGREEMENT to be performed by LICENSEE (collectively, a "NonMonetary Default"), and such NonMonetary default continues for a period of thirty (30) days after written notice has been given by LICENSORE to LICENSEE specifying the NonMonetary Default, unless the NonMonetary Default, by necessity, will require more than thirty (30) days to cure and LICENSEE has commenced actions necessary to cure that NonMonetary Default within said thirty (30) day

period and is diligently pursuing the same to completion, then, in the event of any of the above events, LICENSOR may declare a breach of this AGREEMENT by written notice to LICENSEE and exercise any one or more of the rights available to LICENSOR under the laws of the State of California, including without limitation, the right:

- (a) to terminate this AGREEMENT immediately and without further notice to LICENSEE, and recover (i) the unpaid fees which have been earned at the time of termination; and (ii) any other reasonable monetary amount necessary to compensate LICENSOR for all the detriment suffered by LICENSOR which was proximately caused by LICENSEE'S default under this AGREEMENT, including all costs of litigation and attorney's fees incurred by LICENSOR.
- (b) to seek such equitable or other relief as may be available to LICENSOR by law.

The USC Suzanne Dworak-Peck School of Social Work, University of Southern California (the "School"), designates Laguna Beach Unified School District

(the "Agency") as a School approved setting for instruction in the School's program of education for social work. The School and the Agency commit themselves to cooperative efforts, as described below, in provision of supervised educational field experiences for students. This agreement becomes effective upon 05/29/2019 and remains in force until 05/29/2022 . This agreement may be renewed annually upon mutual agreement of the parties.

## THE SCHOOL AGREES TO:

- Work cooperatively with the Agency in designing appropriate field learning experiences to meet the objectives of the School's field education program.
- Select and/or recommend for placement at the Agency students who appear to be most appropriate. It is understood that the Agency will have the opportunity to meet the students before placement begins.
- Provide on-line access to the School's field manual plus other pertinent instructional material, such as: academic calendar, course outlines, field bulletins, evaluation guidelines, periodic updates.
- Keep Agency and Field Instructors informed about School activities and plans affecting field education.
- Provide opportunities for Agency/Field Instructor participation in relevant School committees and activities.
- Notify students that they are subject, during their educational field experience at Agency, to applicable Agency regulations and that they must conform to the same standards as are set for Agency's employees in matters relating to the welfare of clients or patients and general Agency operation.
- The School requires that student interns obtain professional malpractice insurance through a blanket policy secured by the School, before beginning their field placement experience. The coverage liability limits are \$1,000,000 each claim, and \$3,000,000 aggregate.

#### THE AGENCY AGREES TO:

- Adhere to the goals of the School as presented in its field education manual except in any circumstances wherein a said goal conflicts with Agency's stated policy, rule, or procedure.
- Accept and treat the student's primary role as a learner and the field placement assignment as an educational experience. This includes the following:
  - a) permitting the student to receive needed support, assistance and instruction;
  - b) making available to the student appropriate cases and learning activities; and
  - c) permitting the student to participate in staff development and other training opportunities.
- Provide the student with the resources necessary to carry out assigned educational and service tasks, including the following:
  - a) space that is sufficiently private for carrying on independent work and activity;
  - b) clerical service and supplies for records and reports produced for the agency: and
  - c) access to client and Agency records as appropriate to assigned tasks.
- Provide qualified staff as Field Instructors for the student, subject to approval by the School.
- Assure that the Field Education Liaison is advised of policy and service changes and developments which may affect student learning or the School's curriculum.
- Provide for reimbursement of all student travel expenses on Agency business that has approval of Field Instructor.
- Provide the student with information available to its employees regarding personal safety, when carrying out agency related assignments.
- Provide the student with copies of harassment (including sexual harassment) and protected-class discrimination policies and reporting procedures that Agency has in place.
- Provide students with the name and contact information of personnel that Agency has designated for reporting harassment and protected-class discrimination in the workplace.

The Agency signatory is authorized by the Agency to sign for the agency and acknowledges having read and understood all of the terms and provisions of the Agreement, including the reverse side hereof, and agrees to be bound by all the terms and provisions contained herein upon the execution of this Agreement

#### TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1) <u>Coordination of Program</u>. The parties shall use best efforts to establish the educational objectives for the program, devise methods for its implementation, and continually evaluate to determine the effectiveness of the clinical experience.
- 2) <u>Students Not School Employees</u>. The parties hereto agree that the School's students are fulfilling specific requirements for clinical experiences as part of a degree requirement and, therefore, the School's students are not to be considered employees or agents of either the School or the Agency for any purpose, including Worker's Compensation or employee benefit programs.
- 3) Insurance. Each party to this Agreement shall provide and maintain, at its own expense, a program of insurance covering its activities and operations hereunder. Such program of insurance shall include, but not be limited to, comprehensive general liability and professional liability with reasonable minimum coverage common in the relevant industry. Upon written request, either party shall provide the other with a certificate evidencing such coverage.
- 4) <u>Termination</u>. This Agreement may be terminated by either party with or without cause upon ninety (90) days written notice, provided that all students currently enrolled in the program at the time of notice of termination shall be given the opportunity to complete the program.
- 5) Arbitration. All controversies, claims and disputes arising in connection with this Agreement shall be settled by mutual consultation between the parties in good faith as promptly as possible, but failing an amicable settlement shall be settled finally by arbitration in accordance with the provisions of this Section. Such arbitration shall be conducted in Los Angeles, California, in accordance with the Commercial Arbitration Rules of the American Arbitration Association ("AAA"). The parties hereto hereby agree that the arbitration procedure provided for herein shall be the sole and exclusive method of resolving any and all of the aforesaid controversies, claims or disputes. The costs and expenses of the arbitration, including without limitation attorneys' fees, shall be borne by the parties in the manner determined by the arbitrator.
- 6) No Agency. Both parties acknowledge that they are independent contractors, and nothing contained herein shall be deemed to create an agency, joint venture, franchise, or partnership relation between the parties.

- 7) <u>Assignment</u>. Neither party hereto shall have the right, directly or indirectly, to assign, transfer, convey or encumber any of its rights under this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other party. Subject to the foregoing, this Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the respective successors and assigns of the parties.
- 8) Governing Law. This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with and all disputes hereunder shall be governed by the laws of the State of California.
- 9) <u>Counterparts</u>. This agreement may be executed in one or more counterpart copies. Each counterpart copy shall constitute an agreement and all of the counterpart copies shall constitute one fully executed agreement. This Agreement may be executed on facsimile counterparts.
- 10) Entire Agreement. This Agreement fully supersedes any and all prior agreements or understandings between the parties hereto or any of their respective affiliates with respect to the subject matter hereof, and no change in, modification of or addition, amendment or supplement to this Agreement shall be valid unless set forth in writing and signed and dated by both parties hereto subsequent to the execution of this Agreement.
- 11) Patient Privacy. The parties hereto affirm their commitment to comply with federal and state law regarding the use and disclosure of protected health information. Each party agrees to comply with the applicable provisions of the Administrative Simplification section of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996, as codified at 42 U.S.C. § 1320d through d-8 ("HIPAA"), and the requirements of any regulations promulgated thereunder including without limitation the federal privacy regulations as contained in 45 CFR Part 164 (the "Federal Security Regulations"). Staff recommends the Board of Education approve the expulsion of the student pursuant to the terms outlined in the Stipulated Expulsion Agreement and Rehabilitation Plan.

## **Background**

Pursuant to Education Code §48900(c) a student who has committed the following acts is subject to discipline by suspension or expulsion when other means of correction are not feasible or have repeatedly failed to bring about proper conduct:

Education Code §48900(c) Unlawfully possessed, used, sold, or otherwise furnished, or been under the influence of, any controlled substance listed in Chapter 2 (commencing with Section 11053) of Division 10 of the Health and Safety Code, an alcoholic beverage, or an intoxicant of any kind.

In accordance with California Education Code §35146, §48912, §48918, and §48919, actions of student discipline relative to expulsions are reviewed and acted upon by the Board of Education.

The Laguna Beach Unified School District and the parents of the Laguna Beach High School student agreed to a Stipulated Expulsion Agreement and Rehabilitation Plan. Should the Board of Education approve the Stipulated Expulsion Agreement, the student will immediately enroll in an alternative education program for the duration of the period of expulsion. Upon successful completion of the Rehabilitation Plan, the student will be eligible to apply for reinstatement in the District. If any of the conditions of the Stipulated Expulsion Agreement and Rehabilitation Plan are not met, or if there are any violations of California Education Code §48900/48915, et. seq., the expulsion will be continued until such time as compliance with the terms has been completely met.

## **Budget Impact**

No budget impact.

## **Recommended Action**

Staff recommends the Board of Education approve the expulsion of the student pursuant to the terms outlined in the Stipulated Expulsion Agreement and Rehabilitation Plan.

## Report on Weighted Grades/Credit at Laguna Beach High School

### **Proposal**

Staff will provide information to the Board of Education in response to questions presented by the Board and discussion held at the April 23, 2019 Board meeting regarding weighted grades/credit at Laguna Beach High School.

## **Background**

On April 23, 2019, at the request of a community member, the Board received input from members of the community regarding the policy and practices of weighting grades at Laguna Beach High School. During that discussion, the Board requested a general presentation be provided on the whole topic at the May 28 Board meeting. The presentation will include information on the number of students enrolling in honors classes, how many weighted and AP classes are currently offered at LBHS, whether a determination can be made if merit scholarships have been affected, as well as a review of the UC criteria for a course to be considered as Honors.

In 2016, the Board directed staff to form a committee to review the LBUSD course weighting practices for equity and consistency. The recommendation of the committee that was approved by the Board was to follow the University of California criteria for weighting of honors/AP courses. The University of California assigns an additional weight to grades received in honors level or Advanced Placement courses to encourage students to undertake more challenging work at the advanced level in high school. The University of California uses a specific and narrow definition of honors level work and high schools must ensure identified courses demonstrate distinctive features that set it apart from regular high school courses. Honors weighted courses must be comparable in terms of workload and rigor to Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate, or introductory college-level courses in the subject. Additionally, the University of California Office of the President site (UC Doorways) site, the four items below distinguish a course as honors.

- 1. Honors-level courses are specialized, advanced courses designed for 10th-, 11th-or 12th-graders who have already completed foundation work in the subject area. High school courses offered at the grade 9 level that schools might locally designate as "honors" are not eligible for the UC honors designation.
- 2. Courses must have established prerequisites, as appropriate to the discipline.

- 3. Honors-level courses must have a comprehensive final examination or a substantive, culminating project. The purpose of the final exam/project is for students to exhibit depth of knowledge and sustained mastery of subject material.
- 4. In general, it is highly recommended [but not required] high school courses being considered for the UC honors designation will have a non-honors equivalent course offered at the same frequency (e.g., annually, every other year, etc.), in the same subject area, and at the same grade level

In addition to this general UC honors criteria list, each subject area has additional specifications for honors weighting of courses.

At this current time, Laguna Beach High School offers 27 UC approved weighted honors courses and an additional 2 courses, Honors English 10 and Algebra II Honors, have been submitted to the UC for honors weight and are pending approval bringing the total to 29 UC approved honors weighted courses. The courses not approved by the UC to receive honors credit include the following: Honors English 9 (9th-grade courses are not eligible to receive UC Honors designation), and Honors Spanish II, III, IV.

## **Budget Impact**

There is no budget impact for this report.

## **Recommended Action**

Approval: Mosaic Network, Inc. (CoVitalityApp), California Student Privacy Agreement and Scope of Services for the 2019-20 School Year at a

Cost Not-to-Exceed \$8,505

## **Proposal**

Staff proposes the Board of Education approve the contract to continue work with Mosaic Network, Inc., for the 2019-20 school year. Staff will utilize Mosaic Network's CoVitalityApp's sequential research services, which include unlimited access to the CoVitality Online Education Research Library.

## **Background**

LBUSD is committed to supporting students K-12 in the development of positive personal and interpersonal skills to enhance academic achievement, positive decision-making, and long-term social-emotional health outcomes. In order to more effectively measure social-emotional functioning for students in K-12 grades, a team of school-based mental health professionals within the district evaluated multiple universal screening options. The team recommended the utilization of Mosaic Network Inc.'s online software, CoVitalityApp, as a method of collecting self-report information from students within a two-factor model of mental health: 1) Social-emotional distress, and 2) CoVitality, the combination of 12 validated human capital constructs that relate to a student's sense of social and emotional well-being. The team selected the Student Risk Screening Scale (SRSS) as a brief universal screener that measures internalizing and externalizing risk on a 12-item scale for implementation in K-3. We use Illuminate to host the assessment and scoring for the SRSS and there is no cost or contract associated with implementation in K-3 as the content is public domain.

The proposed contract will enable LBUSD to deliver multiple covitality and social-emotional distress surveys to students in 4<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grades in the fall and in the spring, via an online survey. The scope of the software agreement includes:

- Software and system configuration;
- Online application survey administration for unlimited use;
- Comprehensive report portfolio, including student reports and parent communication; classroom reports; schoolwide reports; pre/post results; and districtwide results;
- Data analysis to provide information briefs; student, schoolwide, and districtwide insights and results; and data validity and completeness statistics.

LCAP Goal 1: Increase student academic achievement and social/emotional strength through collaboration, critical thinking, creativity, and communication.

# **Budget Impact**

The cost of the service agreement for the 2019-2020 school year is \$8,505.

# **Recommended Action**

Staff recommends the Board of Education approve the Mosaic Network, Inc. California Student Privacy Agreement for the 2019-20 school year at a cost not-to-exceed \$8,505.

#### AN OVERVIEW OF THE CALIFORNIA STUDENT DATA PRIVACY AGREEMENT

Introduction: Since the passage of AB 1584, (now found at California Education Code section 49073.1), school districts have struggled to incorporate its required provisions in their contracts with digital providers. Two reasons account for a large portion of these difficulties. First, school districts often do not have the legal resources to negotiate with legally compliant privacy provisions, especially when they are negotiating with digital providers who may be resistant to change contract provisions the providers have crafted for their own purposes often at considerable expense. Second, other school districts are often reluctant to adopt the products for their school district, especially if they do not know whether these other agreements have been legally reviewed, and by persons who are comfortable in the new law of data privacy.

The California Student Data Privacy Agreement (referred to here as the "DPA") attempts to tackle these two challenges head on. First, it has been reviewed by several sets of legal and subject matter experts ranging from the Federal government, private attorneys, and educators working in the data privacy field both within the State of California and beyond. Users of this document can know, with a high degree of confidence, that it meets both the requirements of Federal and California State law.

School districts using this DPA for their digital contracts can, by uploading the executed DPA into the California Student Privacy Alliance ("CSPA") website, make the DPA available for use by other school districts. This includes school districts both within California and outside of California, since California is now a member of a nationwide data contract exchange maintained by the Student Data Privacy Consortium ("SDPC").

<u>Practical Document</u>: Legal compliance was not the only objective of the drafters of this DPA. They also sought to make this a practical and useful document; therefore this document contains provisions that will be of assistance to those persons, at the District and the Vendors who will administer the digital program established by the underlying agreement. We will briefly note some of the more important provisions of the DPA:

- (a) Nature of Digital Services: Paragraph 2 of Article I of the DPA describes the service to be provided by the digital vendor. Such a description is often missing in many digital contracts. Having a short and workable summary of the services will also provide a description of the benefits of such a service to members of the educational community, a vital component in the acceptance and dissemination of educational digital products.
- (b) Types of Data to be Transferred: Paragraph 3 of Article I, provides an opportunity for the Vendor and the District to list the types of student data that the providers will need in order to perform its services. This listing can be accomplished either by listing the types of data to be transferred in the text of the DPA or by checking the data "boxes" in Exhibit B, the Schedule of Data, attached to the DPA.

- (c) Descriptions of Data Security. This provision is found at Paragraph 1 of Article V. It was perhaps the most challenging section of the DPA, especially given the lack of specific data security requirements in California law. We therefore resorted to some helpful categories of data protection, (including regulating Provider Subprocessors, a topic often neglected in the law). The paragraph while also allowing the provider to flesh out their security measures in an attachment to the DPA. We are optimistic that provider attachments will increase public confidence in digital products, because it has been our experience that many digital providers have elaborate and robust data security systems.
- (d) *Definitions*: In development of the DPA, we found that different laws used identical terms but with different meanings. To avoid confusion and enable all stakeholders to understand the DPA, we felt an important component was a Definition of Terms or Exhibit C.

<u>Partnership</u>: Readers of this DPA may detect a more "neutral" tone than that found in many DPAs and which takes into account provider interests. This includes the creation of commensurate data protection duties for school districts. This approach is deliberate. The authors of this DPA believe that to be effective, digital contracts must create a partnership, a recognition that is as vitally important to providers as well as school district to protect the integrity of student data.

Scalability: Perhaps the most ambitious section of the DPA is the "General Offer of Terms" by the Provider regarding student data privacy rights. Providers making this voluntary offer (found at Exhibit "E"), agree to be bound to the same privacy terms as found in the DPA to other, future school districts who also sign the DPA. Why would a provider ascribe to this offer? Because they, like school districts, also wish to avoid the transaction costs and uncertainties of separately negotiating the privacy sections of their data agreements with individual school districts. They are also protected by the fact that the privacy offer does not include such items as pricing, which the providers are free to negotiate separately, and by the limited duration of the offer.

<u>Length</u>: The drafting of contracts frequently involves the sacrifice of certain principles. Here the sacrificed quality may be compactness. This DPA is rather long, but it is long for four reasons. First, it hopes to be versatile and used in a number of settings. To do so it must be comprehensive. Secondly in order to be useful, it employs several attachments which could, in the appropriate circumstances, be discarded. Third, the formatting and font size is generous for ease of reading. The font size can be decreased. Finally, the world of digital education is complicated and changing. Perhaps it is in this is the one context where we can venture to say that brevity is not a virtue.

#### RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Provider has agreed to provide the Local Education Agency ("LEA") with certain digital educational services ("Services") pursuant to a contract dated 05/28/2019 ("Service Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, in order to provide the Services described in the Service Agreement, the Provider may receive and the LEA may provide documents or data that are covered by several federal and statutes, among them, the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act ("FERPA") at 20 U.S.C. 1232g, Children's Online Privacy Protection Act ("COPPA"), 15 U.S.C. 6501-6502; Protection of Pupil Rights Amendment ("PPRA") 20 U.S.C. 1232 h; and

WHEREAS, the documents and data transferred from California LEAs are also subject to several California student privacy laws, including AB 1584, found at California Education Code Section 49073.1 and the Student Online Personal Information Protection Act (sometimes referred to as either "SB 1177" or "SOPIPA") found at California Business and Professions Code section 22584; and

WHEREAS, the Parties wish to enter into this DPA to ensure that the Service Agreement conforms to the requirements of the privacy laws referred to above and to establish implementing procedures and duties; and

WHEREAS, the Provider may, by signing the "General Offer of Privacy Terms", agrees to allow other LEAs in California the opportunity to accept and enjoy the benefits of this DPA for the Services described herein, without the need to negotiate terms in a separate DPA.

NOW THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration, the parties agree as follows:

#### ARTICLE I: PURPOSE AND SCOPE

- 1. Purpose of DPA. The purpose of this DPA is to describe the duties and responsibilities to protect student data transmitted to Provider from the LEA pursuant to the Service Agreement, including compliance with all applicable privacy statutes, including the FERPA, PPRA, COPPA, SB 1177 (SOPIPA), and AB 1584. In performing these services, the Provider shall be considered a School Official with a legitimate educational interest, and performing services otherwise provided by the LEA. Provider shall be under the direct control and supervision of the LEA. Control duties are set forth below.
- 2. <u>Nature of Services Provided</u>. The Provider has agreed to provide the following digital educational services described below and as may be further outlined in <u>Exhibit "A"</u> hereto:

3. <u>Student Data to Be Provided</u>. In order to perform the Services described in the Service Agreement, LEA shall provide the categories of data described below or as indicated in the Schedule of Data, attached hereto as Exhibit "B":

Use of online portal and application for the administration of student surveys.

4. <u>DPA Definitions</u>. The definition of terms used in this DPA is found in <u>Exhibit "C"</u>. In the event of a conflict, definitions used in this DPA shall prevail over term used in the Service Agreement.

#### ARTICLE II: DATA OWNERSHIP AND AUTHORIZED ACCESS

- 1. Student Data Property of LEA. All Student Data or any other Pupil Records transmitted to the Provider pursuant to the Service Agreement is and will continue to be the property of and under the control of the LEA. The Parties agree that as between them all rights, including all intellectual property rights in and to Student Data or any other Pupil Records contemplated per the Service Agreement shall remain the exclusive property of the LEA. For the purposes of FERPA, the Provider shall be considered a School Official, under the control and direction of the LEAs as it pertains to the use of student data notwithstanding the above. Provider may transfer pupil-generated content to a separate account, according to the procedures set forth below.
- 2. Parent Access. LEA shall establish reasonable procedures by which a parent, legal guardian, or eligible student may review personally identifiable information on the pupil's records, correct erroneous information, and procedures for the transfer of pupil-generated content to a personal account, consistent with the functionality of services. Provider shall respond in a reasonably timely manner to the LEA's request for personally identifiable information in a pupil's records held by the Provider to view or correct as necessary. In the event that a parent of a pupil or other individual contacts the Provider to review any of the Pupil Records of Student Data accessed pursuant to the Services, the Provider shall refer the parent or individual to the LEA, who will follow the necessary and proper procedures regarding the requested information.
- 3. <u>Separate Account</u>. Provider shall, at the request of the LEA, transfer Student generated content to a separate student account.
- 4. Third Party Request. Should a Third Party, including law enforcement and government entities, contact Provider with a request for data held by the Provider pursuant to the Services, the Provider shall redirect the Third Party to request the data directly from the LEA. Provider shall notify the LEA in advance of a compelled disclosure to a Third Party unless legally prohibited.

- 5. <u>No Unauthorized Use</u>. Provider shall not use Student Data or information in a Pupil Record for any purpose other than as explicitly specified in the Service Agreement.
- **6.** <u>Subprocessors</u>. Provider shall enter into written agreements with all Subprocessors performing functions pursuant to the Service Agreement, whereby the Subprocessors agree protect Student Data in manner consistent with the terms of this DPA

#### ARTICLE III: DUTIES OF LEA

- 1. <u>Provide Data In Compliance With FERPA</u>. LEA shall provide data for the purposes of the Service Agreement in compliance with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act ("FERPA"), 20 U.S.C. section 1232 g, AB 1584 and the other privacy statutes quoted in this DPA.
- 2. <u>Reasonable Precautions</u>. LEA shall take reasonable precautions to secure usernames, passwords, and any other means of gaining access to the services and hosted data.
- **3.** <u>Unauthorized Access Notification</u>. LEA shall notify Provider promptly of any known or suspected unauthorized access. LEA will assist Provider in any efforts by Provider to investigate and respond to any unauthorized access.
- 4. <u>District Representative</u>. At request of Provider, LEA shall designate an employee or agent of the District as the District representative for the coordination and fulfillment of the duties of this DPA.

#### ARTICLE IV: DUTIES OF PROVIDER

- 1. <u>Privacy Compliance</u>. The Provider shall comply with all California and Federal laws and regulations pertaining to data privacy and security, including FERPA, COPPA, PPRA, AB 1584, and SOPIPA.
- 2. <u>Authorized Use</u>. The data shared pursuant to the Service Agreement, including persistent unique identifiers, shall be used for no purpose other than the Services stated in the Service Agreement and/or otherwise authorized under the statutes referred to in subsection (1), above.
- 3. <u>Employee Obligation</u>. Provider shall require all employees and agents who have access to Student Data to comply with all applicable provisions of FERPA laws with respect to the data shared under the Service Agreement. Provider agrees to require and maintain an appropriate confidentiality agreement from each employee or agent with access to Student Data pursuant to the Service Agreement.

- **4.** <u>No Disclosure</u>. Provider shall not disclose any data obtained under the Service Agreement in a manner that could identify an individual student to any other entity in published results of studies as authorized by the Service Agreement. Deidentified information may be used by the vendor for the purposes of development and improvement of educational sites, services, or applications.
- 5. Disposition of Data. Provider shall dispose of all personally identifiable data obtained under the Service Agreement when it is no longer needed for the purpose for which it was obtained and transfer said data to LEA or LEA's designee within 60 days of the date of termination and according to a schedule and procedure as the Parties may reasonably agree. Nothing in the Service Agreement authorizes Provider to maintain personally identifiable data obtained under the Service Agreement beyond the time period reasonably needed to complete the disposition. Disposition shall include (1) the shredding of any hard copies of any Pupil Records; (2) Erasing; or (3) Otherwise modifying the personal information in those records to make it unreadable or indecipherable. Provider shall provide written notification to LEA when the Data has been disposed. The duty to dispose of Student Data shall not extend to data that has been de-identified or placed in a separate Student account, pursuant to the other terms of the DPA. Nothing in the Service Agreement authorizes Provider to maintain personally identifiable data beyond the time period reasonably needed to complete the disposition.
- **6.** Advertising Prohibition. Provider is prohibited from using Student Data to conduct or assist targeted advertising directed at students or their families/guardians. This prohibition includes the development of a profile of a student, or their families/guardians or group, for any commercial purpose other than providing the service to client. This shall not prohibit Providers from using data to make product or service recommendations to LEA.

#### ARTICLE V: DATA PROVISIONS

- 1. <u>Data Security</u>. The Provider agrees to abide by and maintain adequate data security measures to protect Student Data from unauthorized disclosure or acquisition by an unauthorized person. The general security duties of Provider are set forth below. Provider may further detail its security programs and measures in in <u>Exhibit "D"</u> hereto. These measures shall include, but are not limited to:
  - a. Passwords and Employee Access. Provider shall make best efforts practices to secure usernames, passwords, and any other means of gaining access to the Services or to Student Data, at a level suggested by Article 4.3 of NIST 800-63-3. Provider shall only provide access to Student Data to employees or contractors that are performing the Services. As stated elsewhere in this DPA, employees with access to Student Data shall have signed confidentiality agreements regarding said Student Data. All employees with access to Student Records shall pass criminal background checks.
  - **b. Destruction of Data**. Provider shall destroy all personally identifiable data obtained under the Service Agreement when it is no longer needed for the purpose for which it was

- obtained or transfer said data to LEA or LEA's designee, according to a schedule and procedure as the parties may reasonable agree. Nothing in the Service Agreement authorizes Provider to maintain personally identifiable data beyond the time period reasonably needed to complete the disposition.
- c. Security Protocols. Both parties agree to maintain security protocols that meet industry best practices in the transfer or transmission of any data, including ensuring that data may only be viewed or accessed by parties legally allowed to do so. Provider shall maintain all data obtained or generated pursuant to the Service Agreement in a secure computer environment and not copy, reproduce, or transmit data obtained pursuant to the Service Agreement, except as necessary to fulfill the purpose of data requests by LEA.
- **d.** Employee Training. The Provider shall provide periodic security training to those of its employees who operate or have access to the system. Further, Provider shall provide LEA with contact information of an employee who LEA may contact if there are any security concerns or questions.
- e. Security Technology. When the service is accessed using a supported web browser, Secure Socket Layer ("SSL"), or equivalent technology protects information, using both server authentication and data encryption to help ensure that data are safe secure only to authorized users. Provider shall host data pursuant to the Service Agreement in an environment using a firewall that is periodically updated according to industry standards.
- **f. Security Coordinator**. Provider shall provide the name and contact information of Provider's Security Coordinator for the Student Data received pursuant to the Service Agreement
- g. Subprocessors Bound. Provider shall enter into written agreements whereby Subprocessors agree to secure and protect Student Data in a manner consistent with the terms of this Article V. Provider shall periodically conduct or review compliance monitoring and assessments of Subprocessors to determine their compliance with this Article.
- 2. <u>Data Breach</u>. In the event that Student Data is accessed or obtained by an unauthorized individual, Provider shall provide notification to LEA within a reasonable amount of time of the incident. Provider shall follow the following process:
  - a. The security breach notification shall be written in plain language, shall be titled "Notice of Data Breach," and shall present the information described herein under the following headings: "What Happened," "What Information Was Involved," "What We Are Doing," "What You Can Do," and "For More Information." Additional information may be provided as a supplement to the notice.
  - **b.** The security breach notification described above in section 2(a) shall include, at a minimum, the following information:
    - i. The name and contact information of the reporting LEA subject to this section.
    - ii. A list of the types of personal information that were or are reasonably believed to have been the subject of a breach.

- iii. If the information is possible to determine at the time the notice is provided, then either (1) the date of the breach, (2) the estimated date of the breach, or (3) the date range within which the breach occurred. The notification shall also include the date of the notice.
- iv. Whether the notification was delayed as a result of a law enforcement investigation, if that information is possible to determine at the time the notice is provided.
- v. A general description of the breach incident, if that information is possible to determine at the time the notice is provided.
- c. At LEA's discretion, the security breach notification may also include any of the following:
  - i. Information about what the agency has done to protect individuals whose information has been breached.
  - ii. Advice on steps that the person whose information has been breached may take to protect himself or herself.
- d. Any agency that is required to issue a security breach notification pursuant to this section to more than 500 California residents as a result of a single breach of the security system shall electronically submit a single sample copy of that security breach notification, excluding any personally identifiable information, to the Attorney General. Provider shall assist LEA in these efforts.
- e. At the request and with the assistance of the District, Provider shall notify the affected parent, legal guardian or eligible pupil of the unauthorized access, which shall include the information listed in subsections (b) and (c), above.

#### ARTICLE VI: GENERAL OFFER OF PRIVACY TERMS

Provider may, by signing the attached Form of General Offer of Privacy Terms ("General Offer"), (attached hereto as <u>Exhibit "E"</u>), be bound by the terms of this DPA to any other LEA who signs the Acceptance on said Exhibit. The Form is limited by the terms and conditions described therein.

### **ARTICLE VII: MISCELLANEOUS**

- 1. <u>Term.</u> The Provider shall be bound by this DPA for the duration of the Service Agreement or so long as the Provider maintains any Student Data. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Provider agrees to be bound by the terms and obligations of this DPA for no less than three (3) years.
- 2. <u>Termination</u>. In the event that either party seeks to terminate this DPA, they may do so by mutual written consent so long as the Service Agreement has lapsed or has been terminated.
- 3. Effect of Termination Survival. If the Service Agreement is terminated, the Provider shall

destroy all of LEA's data pursuant to Article V, section 1(b).

- 4. <u>Priority of Agreements</u>. This DPA shall govern the treatment of student records in order to comply with the privacy protections, including those found in FERPA and AB 1584. In the event there is conflict between the terms of the DPA and the Service Agreement, or with any other bid/RFP, license agreement, or writing, the terms of this DPA shall apply and take precedence. Except as described in this paragraph herein, all other provisions of the Service Agreement shall remain in effect.
- 5. <u>Notice</u>. All notices or other communication required or permitted to be given hereunder must be in writing and given by personal delivery, facsimile or e-mail transmission (if contact information is provided for the specific mode of delivery), or first class mail, postage prepaid, sent to the addresses set forth herein.
- **6.** Application of Agreement to Other Agencies. Provider may agree by signing the General Offer of Privacy Terms be bound by the terms of this DPA for the services described therein for any Successor Agency who signs a Joinder to this DPA.
- 7. Entire Agreement. This DPA constitutes the entire agreement of the parties relating to the subject matter hereof and supersedes all prior communications, representations, or agreements, oral or written, by the parties relating thereto. This DPA may be amended and the observance of any provision of this DPA may be waived (either generally or in any particular instance and either retroactively or prospectively) only with the signed written consent of both parties. Neither failure nor delay on the part of any party in exercising any right, power, or privilege hereunder shall operate as a waiver of such right, nor shall any single or partial exercise of any such right, power, or privilege preclude any further exercise thereof or the exercise of any other right, power, or privilege.
- 8. Severability. Any provision of this DPA that is prohibited or unenforceable in any jurisdiction shall, as to such jurisdiction, be ineffective to the extent of such prohibition or unenforceability without invalidating the remaining provisions of this DPA, and any such prohibition or unenforceability in any jurisdiction shall not invalidate or render unenforceable such provision in any other jurisdiction. Notwithstanding the foregoing, if such provision could be more narrowly drawn so as not to be prohibited or unenforceable in such jurisdiction while, at the same time, maintaining the intent of the parties, it shall, as to such jurisdiction, be so narrowly drawn without invalidating the remaining provisions of this DPA or affecting the validity or enforceability of such provision in any other jurisdiction.
- **9.** Governing Law; Venue and Jurisdiction. THIS DPA WILL BE GOVERNED BY AND CONSTRUED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA,

WITHOUT REGARD TO CONFLICTS OF LAW PRINCIPLES. EACH PARTY CONSENTS AND SUBMITS TO THE SOLE AND EXCLUSIVE JURISDICTION TO THE STATE AND FEDERAL COURTS LOCATED IN Orange COUNTY, CALIFORNIA FOR ANY DISPUTE ARISING OUT OF OR RELATING TO THIS SERVICE AGREEMENT OR THE TRANSACTIONS CONTEMPLATED HEREBY.

# EXHIBIT "C"

# **DEFINITIONS**

**AB 1584, Buchanan:** The statutory designation for what is now California Education Code § 49073.1, relating to pupil records.

**De-Identifiable Information (DII):** De-Identification refers to the process by which the Vendor removes or obscures any Personally Identifiable Information ("PII") from student records in a way that removes or minimizes the risk of disclosure of the identity of the individual and information about them.

**NIST 800-63-3**: Draft National Institute of Standards and Technology ("NIST") Special Publication 800-63-3 Digital Authentication Guideline.

**Operator:** For the purposes of SB 1177, SOPIPA, the term "operator" means the operator of an Internet Website, online service, online application, or mobile application with actual knowledge that the site, service, or application is used primarily for K-12 school purposes and was designed and marketed for K-12 school purposes. For the purpose of the Service Agreement, the term "Operator" is replaced by the term "Provider." This term shall encompass the term "Third Party," as it is found in AB 1584.

# Information in the Student's Email

**Provider:** For purposes of the Service Agreement, the term "Provider" means provider of digital educational software or services, including cloud-based services, for the digital storage, management, and retrieval of pupil records. Within the Service Agreement the term "Provider" replaces the term "Third Party as defined in California Education Code § 49073.1 (AB 1584, Buchanan), and replaces the term as "Operator" as defined in SB 1177, SOPIPA.

**Pupil Generated Content:** The term "pupil-generated content" means materials or content created by a pupil during and for the purpose of education including, but not limited to, essays, research reports, portfolios, creative writing, music or other audio files, photographs, videos, and account information that enables ongoing ownership of pupil content.

**Pupil Records:** Means both of the following: (1) Any information that directly relates to a pupil that is maintained by LEA and (2) any information acquired directly from the pupil through the use of instructional software or applications assigned to the pupil by a teacher or other local educational LEA employee.

SB 1177, SOPIPA: Once passed, the requirements of SB 1177, SOPIPA were added to Chapter 22.2 (commencing with Section 22584) to Division 8 of the Business and Professions Code relating to privacy.

**Service Agreement**: Refers to the Contract or Purchase Order to which this DPA supplements and modifies.

**School Official**: For the purposes of this Agreement and pursuant to CFR 99.31 (B), a School Official is a contractor that: (1) Performs an institutional service or function for which the agency or institution would otherwise use employees; (2) Is under the direct control of the agency or institution with respect to the use and maintenance of education records; and (3) Is subject to CFR 99.33(a) governing the use and re-disclosure of personally identifiable information from student records.

Student Data: Students Data includes any data, whether gathered by Provider or provided by LEA or its users, students, or students' parents/guardians, that is descriptive of the student including, but not limited to, information in the student's educational record or email, first and last name, home address, telephone number, email address, or other information allowing online contact, discipline records, videos, test results, special education data, juvenile dependency records, grades, evaluations, criminal records, medical records, health records, social security numbers, biometric information, disabilities, socioeconomic information, food purchases, political affiliations, religious information text messages, documents, student identifies, search activity, photos, voice recordings or geolocation information. Student Data shall constitute Pupil Records for the purposes of this Agreement, and for the purposes of California and Federal laws and regulations. Student Data as specified in <a href="Exhibit B">Exhibit B</a> is confirmed to be collected or processed by the Provider pursuant to the Services. Student Data shall not constitute that information that has been anonymized or de-identified, or anonymous usage data regarding a student's use of Provider's services.

**Subscribing LEA**: An LEA that was not party to the original Services Agreement and who accepts the Provider's General Offer of Privacy Terms.

**Subprocessor:** For the purposes of this Agreement, the term "Subprocessor" (sometimes referred to as the "Subcontractor") means a party other than LEA or Provider, who Provider uses for data collection,

analytics, storage, or other service to operate and/or improve its software, and who has access to PII. This term shall also include in it meaning the term "Service Provider," as it is found in SOPIPA.

**Targeted Advertising**: Targeted advertising means presenting an advertisement to a student where the selection of the advertisement is based on student information, student records or student generated content or inferred over time from the usage of the Provider's website, online service or mobile application by such student or the retention of such student's online activities or requests over time.

**Third Party**: The term "Third Party" as appears in California Education Code § 49073.1 (AB 1584, Buchanan) means a provider of digital educational software or services, including cloud-based services, for the digital storage, management, and retrieval of pupil records. However, for the purpose of this Agreement, the term "Third Party" when used to indicate the provider of digital educational software or services is replaced by the term "Provider."

# **Proposal**

Staff proposes the Board of Education approve the job description for Career Counseling Coordinator.

# **Background**

On March 26, 2019, the Board of Education received an information item regarding the K-12 Strong Workforce Program. Beginning in 2018-2019, Education Code § 88827 established a K-12 component of the Strong Workforce Program (K12 SWP) appropriating \$150,000,000 in annual ongoing career technical education (CTE) funding to strengthen the pathways for students from secondary to post-secondary education. The goal of the K12 SWP grant is to increase the levels of college and career readiness among students which will support their successful transition from secondary education to post-secondary education and, ultimately, to career.

Orange County Department of Education (OCDE) collaborated with school districts and colleges to determine common areas of needs for their application. These areas of need included funding for a Career Counseling Coordinator for each district that will regularly collaborate with OCDE and other Orange County districts to organize school career counseling efforts, such as early college credit attainment, industry certifications, work-based learning, etc., to align with Community Colleges.

# **Budget Impact**

There is no impact to the District budget.

# **Recommended Action**

Staff recommends the Board of Education approve the job description for Career Counseling Coordinator.

**Job Description: Career Counseling Coordinator** 

# **BASIC FUNCTION:**

Under direction of Orange County Department of Education and a district director, the Career Counseling Coordinator will assist with the alignment of Career Technical Education curriculum, activities, and counseling efforts with post-secondary institutions. The Career Counseling Coordinator will embed career elements and education systemically and organize school counseling efforts with post-secondary counselors to include early college credit attainment, industry certifications, work-based learning, etc. They will build the imperative for school counselors to help students explore, plan, and pursue careers that reflect their passions, skills, and life goals.

The Career Counseling Coordinator will provide expertise in all aspects of career counseling and instruction related to Career Technical Education. This position will serve as a resource to their school district in the development of career counseling components such as: regional career exploration, public perception of CTE, high school to college to workforce transitions, counseling competencies in accessing, interpreting, and applying relevant data, and counseling support.

The Career Counseling Coordinator will additionally conduct accountability studies that will serve to develop Career Pathways and the articulation with post-secondary institutions and assess the career education needs of their district. The Career Counseling Coordinator will build stronger pathway experiences for students through building early college credit attainment opportunities and providing career exploration by coordinating with post-secondary counselors on a consistent basis. They will create and sustain purposeful Professional Development with regional business/industry partners in the efforts of successful implementation of career counseling and exploration up to and through post-secondary institutions.
