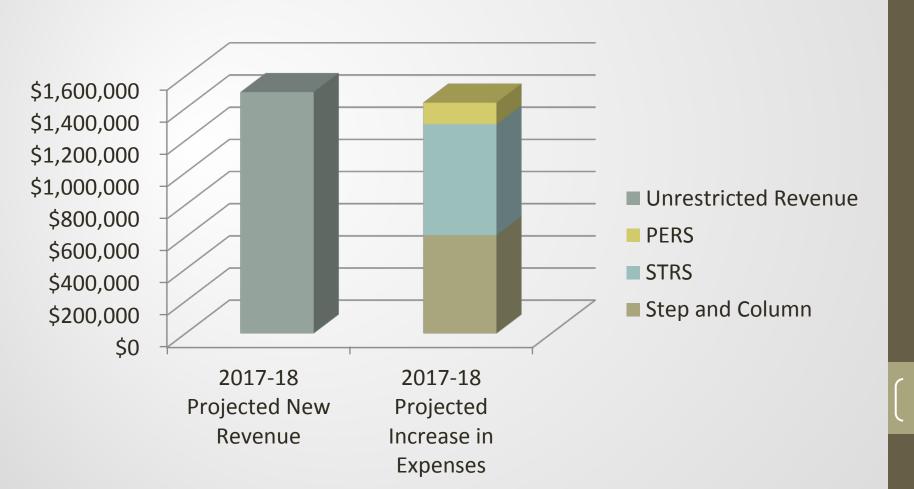
Highlights

- \$5.6 billion decrease in projected revenues from previous budget.
- \$2.2 billion reduction in spending for education from previous budget.
 - The reduction in education spending equates to maintaining the progress towards fully funding LCFF (96%).
- Governor is preparing for tough times.

Key Factors for Laguna Beach

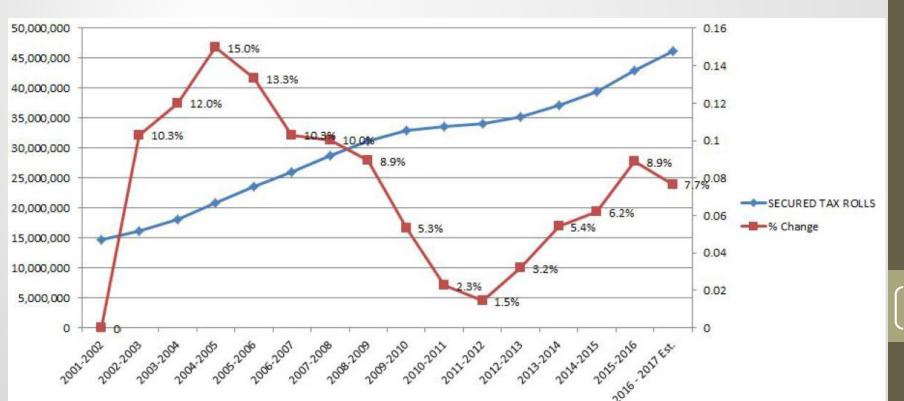
- The 2017 Governor's proposed budget has no effect on current year revenues.
- One-time funding from the State is lowered to \$48 per ADA for 2017-18, versus \$214 in 2016-17. Net result of roughly \$550,000 less funding next year.
- Stakeholder meetings are being held to discuss potential changes in the special education funding model.
- Significant increase in the amount of money the district will need to contribute to STRS and PERS.

Key Factors for Laguna Beach



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 All of the new revenue is based on an assumed growth in property tax receipts, which is volatile.



Increases to Revenue

- Secured Property taxes projection remained the same at 7.67%.
- Adjust State and Local Grants based on award notifications
- Donations budgeted as received

Adjustments to Expenditures

- Facilities Projects
- Expenditures associated with donations and onetime grants
