# Study Session: English Language Arts/English Language Development (ELA/ELD) Framework

Dr. Alysia Odipo and Mrs. Yadhira Rojas shared the expected outcomes for the study session. Participants read and analyzed at least one article on the same topic and shared key information to emphasize different evidence and varying interpretations of facts. Information on text interpretation included Levels on Meaning, Structure, Language Convention and Clarity, and Knowledge Demands. Participants learned close reading strategies and the progression of text-dependent questions.

Dr. Odipo shared how the California Common Core State Standards and the California English Language Development Standards are aligned. She also reviewed the schedule for Curriculum Framework Development and Adoption for K-8 Instruction Materials.

Donations will be collected on campus and "Pops for Pups" will be sold on campus on April 14, 2017. All proceeds will be given directly to Pacific Marine Mammal Center.

## **Budget Impact**

No budget impact will occur as a result of this action.

#### **Recommended Action**

## Approval: 2017 Summer School Program

## **Proposal**

Staff proposes the Board of Education approve the dates and budget for the 2017 Summer School Program according to the following schedule:

- Four weeks of classes for preschool through eighth grade students at Thurston Middle School Tuesday, June 27, 2017 to Friday, July 21, 2017 (No school on July 4<sup>th</sup> holiday)
- Five weeks of classes for high school students at Laguna Beach High School Monday, June 26, 2017 to Friday, July 29, 2017 (No school on July 4<sup>th</sup> holiday)
- August Intensive Behavior Instruction (IBI) Maintenance Program at Thurston Middle School Monday, August 14, 2017 to Friday, August 25, 2017

## **Background**

The Laguna Beach Unified School District offers summer school each year to our students as follows:

- Intervention classes for recommended students in first through eighth grade
- High school credit recovery classes for students as needed to meet high school graduation requirements
- High School enrichment classes for incoming freshmen:
  - o "Breaker 101/ELD" Incoming Freshmen Transition Course
  - o Model United Nations (MUN) Bridge Workshop for students entering grade 9
- High school enrichment classes in Economics and American Government to allow students to complete these required credits and avoid scheduling conflicts in their senior year
- Specialized services for Special Education students entering grades PreK 12 as specified in their IEP as well as an August Intensive Behavior Instruction (IBI) Maintenance opportunity for students entering grades PreK 12 as specified in their Individualized Education Program (IEP)

In addition to the above program, the 2017 summer school program will offer the following opportunities to students:

• "Breaker Advance" will be offered to students new to the AP/honors curriculum to give them the necessary skills to be successful in these classes

## **Budget Impact**

The estimated cost for the 2017 summer school program is expected to be comparable to the 2016 program, which was \$265,000. (Estimated Special Ed Program: \$80,000 Estimated K-12 Program: \$185,000).

## **Recommended Action**

Staff recommends the Board of Education approve the 2017 Summer School Program as outlined above.

## 15. ACTION

## Approval: Career Technical Education Incentive Grant (CTEIG) Expenditures

## **Proposal**

Staff proposes that the Board of Education approve the expenditures from the Laguna Beach Unified School District CTEIG, which have been recommended by the CTE Advisory Team.

## Background

The California Career Technical Education Incentive Grant Program is established as a state education, economic, and workforce development initiative with the goal of providing pupils in kindergarten and grades 1 to 12, inclusive, with the knowledge and skills necessary to transition to employment and postsecondary education. The purpose of this program is to encourage and maintain the delivery of career technical education programs during implementation of the District's Local Control Funding Formula.

Laguna Beach Unified School District is part of a consortium with Capistrano Unified School District (CUSD) and College and Career Advantage (CCA). Within the consortium LBUSD has been allocated \$128, 976.00 for the implementation and expansion of our Career Technical Education (CTE) Program. The CTE Advisory Team met on February 2, 2017, to discuss the use of the allocated funds to improve the LBUSD CTE program. A priority list of purchases was identified and is shown below.

## Approval: Approval of an Independent Contractor Agreement with University of California Irvine, History Project Consulting Services, in an Amount Not-to-Exceed \$19,400.00

## **Proposal**

Staff proposes the Board of Education approve a contract for consulting services by the UC Irvine History Project (UCIHP). This consulting will provide a comprehensive program for elementary and secondary history-social science teachers as they continue to implement the Common Core State Standards and begin to learn about and incorporate the new California History-Social Science Framework into their curriculum. The ideas presented will be adapted to suit the needs of the teachers and district goals.

## **Background**

The History/Social Studies Framework draft was approved on July 14, 2016. Content, Inquiry, Literacy, Citizenship - This framework guides educators as they design, implement, and maintain a coherent course of study to teach content, develop inquiry-based critical thinking skills, improve reading comprehension and expository writing ability, and promote an engaged and knowledgeable citizenry in history and the related social sciences. The subject areas covered in this framework offer students the opportunity to learn about the world and their place in it, think critically, read, write, and communicate clearly.

History, Civics and Government, Geography, and Economics, are integral to our shared mission of preparing California's children for college, careers, and civic life. These disciplines develop our students' understanding of the physical world, encourage their participation in our democratic system of government, teach them about our past, inform their financial choices, and improve their ability to make reasoned decisions based upon evidence. Moreover, these disciplines play a vital role in the development of student literacy, because of their shared emphasis on text, argumentation, and use of evidence. These disciplines have also undergone important shifts in instructional practice since this document was last updated, and thus this framework seeks to bring current the state of these important areas of study. It should also be emphasized that achieving these goals is a shared responsibility. History–social science teachers are encouraged to collaborate with their colleagues in other disciplines to ensure that all students achieve the common goal of readiness for their future as literate, informed, and engaged citizens.

Following is an outline of the proposed professional development plan for our History/Social Studies teachers to be provided by the UCI History Project.

## **Description and Proposed Dates**

Program: Focus on Inquiry (6-12)

- Secondary history teachers will learn about the new California Framework and will work with UCI History Project staff and colleagues to develop inquiry-based scope and sequence that integrates content, literacy skills, and disciplinary inquiry
- The inquiry-based curriculum and training will support teachers as they develop and implement the benchmark assessments
- The UCI History Project can support inquiry-based instruction and curriculum development through a variety of methods: Lesson development, curriculum mapping, and data analysis August 2017 March 2018

Program: Linking Inquiry and Citizenship

- UCI HP staff will partner with high school leadership to develop a workshop to support the implementation of the Framework shifts
- This workshop will emphasize the ways that citizenship skills can be developed through inquiry-based and community learning projects December 2017

Program: History Blueprint Curriculum workshop for Middle School teachers

- Instruction on the implementation of the California History-Social Science Project's History Blueprint. This is an innovative curriculum aligned to the California History-Social Science Framework and the Common Core State Standards. It combines historical investigation, carefully selected primary sources, activities to strengthen reading and writing, and practice evaluating and developing arguments based on historical evidence. This will include a focus on the specific topics of:
- The Civil War March 2018
- Sites of Encounter in the Medieval World (2 days) September 2017 March 2018

Program: Elementary Inquiry and Primary Source workshop

- Update group on Framework and link between inquiry and new standards
- Introduce teachers to the concept of historical inquiry
- Provide teachers with strategies for teaching primary source analysis
- Share resources for finding free and readily available primary sources
- These trainings will be a half day for K-3 and a full day for 4<sup>th</sup> 5<sup>th</sup> January 2018

General Support/Meetings

- Meetings with district administration and teachers to develop a program that specifically meets the needs of the teachers and students
- Regular emails, phone support and meetings throughout year

## **Budget Impact**

The projected cost for this consulting work is not-to-exceed \$19,400.00. The cost will be paid out of the 2017/18 staff development budget.

## **Recommended Action**

Staff recommends the Board of Education approve the Independent Contractor Agreement for consulting services by the UC Irvine History Project to support the implementation of the Common Core State Standards incorporating the new California History-Social Science Framework into their curriculum.

#### INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR AGREEMENT

This AGREEMENT is hereby entered into between the Laguna Beach Unified School District, hereinafter referred to as "DISTRICT," and **University of California, Irvine History Project**, Address: 120 Theory, Suite #150, Irvine, CA 92697, Phone: 949-824-2057; hereinafter referred to as "CONTRACTOR."

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is authorized by Section 53060 of the California Government Code to contract with and employ any persons for the furnishing of special services and advice in financial, economic, accounting, engineering, legal or administrative matters, if such persons are specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required; and

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is in need of such special services and advice; and

WHEREAS, CONTRACTOR is specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required by the DISTRICT, and such services are needed on a limited basis;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

1. <u>Scope of Work</u>. CONTRACTOR shall perform the following services for the DISTRICT: The UCI History Project will provide professional development to teachers at Laguna Beach Unified School District to support the implementation of the California Common Core Standards and the incorporation of the California History-Social Science Framework into their curriculum. Said professional development is outlined in Attachment A to this Agreement.

2. <u>Term</u>. CONTRACTOR shall commence providing services under this AGREEMENT upon Board approval and will diligently perform as required **until June 30, 2018**.

3. <u>Compensation</u>. DISTRICT agrees to pay the CONTRACTOR for services satisfactorily rendered pursuant to this AGREEMENT a total fee not to exceed **\$19,400.00**. DISTRICT shall pay CONTRACTOR according to the following terms and conditions:

4. <u>Expenses</u>. DISTRICT shall not be liable to CONTRACTOR for any costs or expenses paid or incurred by CONTRACTOR in performing services for DISTRICT, except as follows: N/A

5. <u>Independent Contractor</u>. CONTRACTOR, in the performance of this AGREEMENT, shall be and act as an independent contractor. CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that he/she and all of his/her employees shall not be considered officers, employees or agents of the DISTRICT, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of the DISTRICT and/or to which DISTRICT's employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Worker's Compensation. CONTRACTOR assumes the full responsibility for the acts and/or omissions of his/her employees or agents as they relate to the services to be provided under this AGREEMENT. CONTRACTOR shall assume full responsibility for payment of all federal, state and

local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to CONTRACTOR's employees.

6. <u>Materials</u>. CONTRACTOR shall furnish, at his/her own expense, all labor, materials, equipment, supplies and other items necessary to complete the services to be provided pursuant to this AGREEMENT. CONTRACTOR's services will be performed, findings obtained, reports and recommendations prepared in accordance with generally and currently accepted principles and practices of his/her profession.

7. <u>Originality of Services</u>. CONTRACTOR agrees that in providing services pursuant to this AGREEMENT, CONTRACTOR shall obey and comply with all copyright, trademark and patent laws, rules and regulations, including proper identification of all copyrighted materials used.

8. <u>Copyright/Trademark/Patent</u>. CONTRACTOR further understands and agrees that in the event materials are produced pursuant to this AGREEMENT for the benefit of the DISTRICT for which a copyright, trademark and patent may be secured, the DISTRICT shall have the right to such copyright, trademark or patent. CONTRACTOR further understands and agrees that all materials produced for the benefit of the DISTRICT pursuant to this AGREEMENT shall become the DISTRICT'S property, and reuse is subject to the DISTRICT'S express written permission.

9. <u>Termination</u>. DISTRICT may, at any time, with or without reason, terminate this AGREEMENT and compensate CONTRACTOR only for services satisfactorily rendered to the date of termination. Written notice by DISTRICT shall be sufficient to stop further performance of services by CONTRACTOR. Notice shall be deemed given when received by the CONTRACTOR or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

DISTRICT may terminate this AGREEMENT upon giving of written notice of intention to terminate for cause. Cause shall include: (a) material violation of this AGREEMENT by the CONTRACTOR; or (b) any act by CONTRACTOR exposing the DISTRICT to liability to others for personal injury or property damage; or CONTRACTOR is adjudged a bankrupt, CONTRACTOR makes a general assignment for the benefit of creditors or a receiver is appointed on account of CONTRACTOR's insolvency. Written notice by DISTRICT shall contain the reasons for such intention to terminate and unless within five (5) days after service of such notice the condition or violation shall cease, or satisfactory arrangements for the correction thereof be made, this AGREEMENT shall upon the expiration of the five (5) days cease and terminate. In the event of such termination, the DISTRICT may secure the required services from another contractor. If the cost to the DISTRICT exceeds the cost of providing the service pursuant to this AGREEMENT, the excess cost shall be charged to and collected from the CONTRACTOR. The foregoing provisions are in addition to and not a limitation of any other rights or remedies available to DISTRICT. Written notice by DISTRICT shall be deemed given when received by the other party, or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

10. <u>Hold Harmless</u>. CONTRACTOR agrees to and does hereby indemnify, hold harmless and defend the DISTRICT and its governing board, officers, employees and agents from every claim or

demand made and every liability, loss, damage or expense, of any nature whatsoever, which may be incurred by reason of:

(a) Liability for damages for: (1) death or bodily injury to person; (2) injury to, loss or theft of property; or (3) any other loss, damage or expense arising out of (1) or (2) above, sustained by the CONTRACTOR or any person, firm or corporation employed by the CONTRACTOR, either directly or by independent contract, upon or in connection with the services called for in this AGREEMENT, however caused, except for liability for damages referred to above which result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT or its officers, employees or agents.

(b) Any injury to or death of any persons, including the DISTRICT or its officers, employees and agents, or damage to or loss of any property caused by any act, neglect, default, or omission of the CONTRACTOR, or any person, firm or corporation employed by the CONTRACTOR, either directly or by independent contract, arising out of, or in any way connected with, the services covered by this AGREEMENT, whether said injury or damage occurs either on or off DISTRICT's property, except for liability for damages which result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT or its officers, employees or agents.

(c) Any liability for damages which may arise from the furnishing or use of any copyrighted or uncopyrighted matter or patented or unpatented invention under this AGREEMENT.

(d) Any acts or omissions by CONTRACTOR or any person or corporation employed by CONTRACTOR relating to services to be rendered under this Agreement.

11. Insurance. CONTRACTOR agrees to carry a comprehensive general and automobile liability insurance with limits of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage in a form mutually acceptable to both parties to protect CONTRACTOR and DISTRICT against liability or claims of liability which may arise out of this AGREEMENT. In addition, CONTRACTOR agrees to provide an endorsement to this policy stating, "Such insurance as is afforded by this policy shall be primary, and any insurance carried by DISTRICT shall be excess and noncontributory." CONTRACTOR agrees to carry malpractice and/or professional liability insurance in the amount One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000). Prior to the execution of this Agreement, CONTRACTOR shall provide DISTRICT with certificates of insurance evidencing all coverages and endorsements required hereunder including a thirty (30) day written notice of cancellation or reduction in coverage. CONTRACTOR agrees that not less than 30 days prior to the expiration of any coverage, CONTRACTOR will provide evidence of renewal to DISTRICT. CONTRACTOR agrees to name DISTRICT and its officers, agents and employees as additional insureds under said policies. CONTRACTOR shall provide proof of current Worker's Compensation insurance for CONTRACTOR'S employees (if applicable).

12. <u>Assignment</u>. The obligations of the CONTRACTOR pursuant to this AGREEMENT shall not be assigned by the CONTRACTOR without the prior written consent of District.

13. <u>Compliance With Applicable Laws</u>. The services completed herein must meet the approval of the DISTRICT and shall be subject to the DISTRICT's general right of inspection to secure the satisfactory completion thereof. CONTRACTOR agrees to comply with all federal, state and local laws, rules, regulations and ordinances that are now or may in the future become applicable to CONTRACTOR, CONTRACTOR's business, equipment and personnel engaged in operations covered by this AGREEMENT or accruing out of the performance of such operations.

14. <u>Permits/Licenses</u>. CONTRACTOR and all CONTRACTOR's employees or agents shall secure and maintain in force such permits and licenses as are required by law in connection with the furnishing of services pursuant to this AGREEMENT.

15. <u>Employment With Public Agency</u>. CONTRACTOR, if an employee of another public agency, agrees that CONTRACTOR will not receive salary or remuneration, other than vacation pay, as an employee of another public agency for the actual time in which services are actually being performed pursuant to this AGREEMENT.

16. <u>Entire Agreement/Amendment</u>. This AGREEMENT and any exhibits attached hereto constitute the entire agreement among the parties to it and supersedes any prior or contemporaneous understanding or agreement with respect to the services contemplated, and may be amended only by a written amendment executed by both parties to the AGREEMENT.

17. <u>Affirmative Action Employment</u>. CONTRACTOR agrees that it will not engage in unlawful discrimination in employment of persons because of sexual orientation, race, color, religious creed, national origin, ancestry, physical handicap, medical condition, marital status, or sex of such persons.

18. <u>Non Waiver</u>. The failure of DISTRICT or CONTRACTOR to seek redress for violation of, or to insist upon, the strict performance of any term or condition of this AGREEMENT, shall not be deemed a waiver by that party of such term or condition, or prevent a subsequent similar act from again constituting a violation of such term or condition.

19. <u>Notice</u>. All notices or demands to be given under this AGREEMENT by either party to the other, shall be in writing and given either by: (a) personal service or (b) by U.S. Mail, mailed either by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, with postage prepaid. Service shall be considered given when received if personally served or if mailed on the third day after deposit in any U.S. Post Office. The address to which notices or demands may be given by either party may be changed by written notice given in accordance with the notice provisions of this section.

#### Approval: Approval of an Independent Contractor Agreement with University of California Irvine, Math Project Consulting Services, in an Amount Not-to-Exceed \$13,200.00

## **Proposal**

Staff proposes the Board of Education approve a contract for consulting services by the UC Irvine Math Project (UCIMP) to continue their professional development for the high school math teachers in successfully implementing the Common Core standards. The IMP has partnered with the District to build language rich conceptual math lessons to support Algebra I, Geometry and Algebra II classes.

#### **Background**

The Irvine Math Project has provided Laguna Beach High School with nine professional development days for coaching and scope and sequence planning and support in the completion of intervention units for curriculum/lessons. Additionally, they provided two days of training to the Thurston Middle School math teachers.

Laguna Beach High School teachers have asked for continued support from IMP to provide pedagogical content based professional development, unit curriculum/lesson writing, and general support. This proposal includes three days of professional development for grades 9 through 12 as follows: one day for Algebra I, one day for Geometry and one day for Algebra II. Additionally, this proposal includes common core conceptual curriculum for each instructional unity. Each unit will have an outline and come with all conceptual lessons as well as many problem solving book lessons. This outline will suggest best places to supplement the adopted textbook. Each unit is comprised of approximately 10 to 15 one to three-day lessons.

#### **Budget Impact**

The projected cost for this consulting work is not-to-exceed \$13,200.00. The cost will be paid out of the Title II Teacher Quality budget.

#### **Recommended Action**

Staff recommends the Board of Education approve the Independent Contractor Agreement for additional consulting services by the UC Irvine Math Project to support the math teachers in successfully implementing the Common Core standards.



#### Sales and Service Agreement Between Laguna Beach Unified School District and The Regents of the University of California University of California, Irvine (9/2016)

This Agreement for mathematics consultative services and training is by and between The Regents of the University of California, a corporation as established by Article IX, section 9, of the California State Constitution, on behalf of the University of California, Irvine campus Irvine Math Project (hereinafter "University") and Laguna Beach Unified School District, 550 Blumont Street, Laguna Beach, CA 92651 (hereinafter "Buyer").

Except as otherwise limited herein, University shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless Buyer, its officers, employees, and agents from and against any and all liability, loss, expense (including reasonable attorneys' fees), or claims for injury or damages arising out of the performance of this Agreement but only in proportion to and to the extent such liability, loss, expense (including reasonable attorneys' fees), or claims for injury or damage are caused by or result from the negligent or intentional acts or omissions of University, its officers, employees, or agents.

Buyer shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless University, its officers, employees, and agents from and against any and all liability, loss, expense (including reasonable attorneys' fees), or claims for injury or damages arising out of the performance of this Agreement but only in proportion to and to the extent such liability, loss, expense (including reasonable attorneys' fees), or claims for injury or damage are caused by or result from the negligent or intentional acts or omissions of Buyer, its officers, employees, or agents.

Neither termination of this Agreement nor completion of the acts to be performed under this Agreement shall release any party from its obligation to indemnify as to any claims or cause of action asserted so long as the event(s) upon which such claim or cause of action is predicated shall have occurred prior to the effective date of termination or completion.

- B. Insurance
  - 1. Buyer shall provide proof of insurance, naming the University as additional insured, showing amounts of coverage as follows:

IN NO EVENT IS THE REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA LIABLE FOR ANY INCIDENTAL, SPECIAL, OR CONSEQUENTIAL DAMAGES RESULTING FROM THE USE OF THE PRODUCTS AND SERVICES CONTRACTED FOR HEREIN.

D. Conflict of Interest

Buyer affirms that there exists no actual or potential conflict of interest between the parties, including the financial interests of their officers, agents, or employees. Any question regarding a possible conflict of interest will be raised with the University.

E. Equal Opportunity Affirmative Action

Buyer will abide by the requirements set forth in Executive Orders 11246 and 11375. University shall inform its employees that for a period of one year from the end of the Agreement, Confidential Information shall not be used or disclosed to others except in furtherance of this Agreement unless Confidential Information: (i) is or shall have been known to the University before its receipt thereof; (ii) is disclosed to the University by a third party; (iii) is or shall have become known to the public through no fault of the University; or (iv) is required by law to be disclosed.

K. Notice

## LAGUNA BEACH UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT

## NONDISCRIMINATION/HARASSMENT

BP 5145.3 Students

The Governing Board desires to provide a safe school environment that allows all students equal access and opportunities in the district's academic, extracurricular, and other educational support programs, services, and activities. The Board prohibits, at any district school or school activity, unlawful discrimination, harassment, intimidation, and bullying targeted at any student by anyone, based on the student's actual or perceived race, color, ancestry, national origin, nationality, ethnicity, ethnic group identification, age, religion, marital or parental status, physical or mental disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender, gender identity, or gender expression; or association with a person or group with one or more of these actual or perceived characteristics.

This policy shall apply to all acts related to school activity or to school attendance occurring within a district school, and to acts which occur off campus or outside of school-related or school-sponsored activities but which may have an impact or create a hostile environment at school.

Unlawful discrimination, including discrimination, harassment, intimidation, or bullying may result from physical, verbal, nonverbal, or written conduct based on one of the categories listed above. Unlawful discrimination also includes the creation of a hostile environment through prohibited conduct that is so severe or pervasive that it affects a student's ability to participate in or benefit from an educational program or activity; creates an intimidating, threatening, hostile, or offensive educational environment; has the effect of substantially or unreasonably interfering with a student's academic performance; or otherwise adversely affects a student's educational opportunities.

Unlawful discrimination also includes disparate treatment of students based on one of the categories above with respect to the provision of opportunities to participate in school programs or activities or the provision or receipt of educational benefits or services.

The Board also prohibits any form of retaliation against any student who reports or participates in the reporting of unlawful discrimination, files or participates in the filing of a complaint investigates or participates in the investigation of a complaint or report alleging unlawful discrimination. Retaliation complaints shall be investigated and resolved in the same manner as a discrimination complaint.

The Superintendent or designee shall facilitate students' access to the educational program by publicizing the district's nondiscrimination policy and related complaint procedures to students, parents/guardians, and employees. He/she shall provide training and information on the scope and use of the policy and complaint procedures and take other measures designed to increase the school community's understanding of the requirements of law related to discrimination. The

Superintendent or designee shall regularly review the implementation of the district's nondiscrimination policies and practices and, as necessary, shall take action to remove any identified barrier to student access to or participation in the district's educational program. He/she shall report his/her findings and recommendations to the Board after each review.

Regardless of whether a complainant complies with the writing, timeline, and/or other formal filing requirements, all complaints alleging unlawful discrimination, including discriminatory harassment, intimidation, or bullying, shall be investigated and prompt action taken to stop the discrimination, prevent recurrence, and address any continuing effect on students.

Students who engage in unlawful discrimination, including discriminatory harassment, intimidation, bullying, or retaliation in violation of law, Board policy, or administrative regulation shall be subject to appropriate consequence or discipline, up to and including counseling, suspension, and/or expulsion when the behavior is severe or pervasive as defined in Education Code 48900.4. Any employee who permits or engages in prohibited discrimination, including discriminatory harassment, intimidation, bullying, or retaliation shall be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including dismissal.

## **Record-Keeping**

The Superintendent or designee shall maintain a record of all reported cases of unlawful discrimination, including discriminatory harassment, intimidation, or bullying, to enable the district to monitor, address, and prevent repetitive prohibited behavior in district schools.

## **Grievance** Procedures

The following position is the designated Coordinator for Nondiscrimination to handle complaints regarding discrimination, harassment, intimidation, or bullying, and to answer inquiries regarding the district's nondiscrimination policies:

Any student who feels that he/she has been subjected to discrimination, harassment, intimidation, or bullying should immediately contact the Coordinator, the principal, or any other staff member. In addition, any student who observes any such incident should report the incident to the Coordinator or principal, whether or not the victim files a complaint.

Any school employee who observes an incident of discrimination, harassment, intimidation, or bullying or to whom such an incident is reported shall report the incident to the Coordinator or principal, whether or not the victim files a complaint.

In addition, the employee shall immediately intervene when safe to do so.

Upon receiving a complaint of discrimination, harassment, intimidation, or bullying, the Coordinator shall immediately investigate the complaint in accordance with the district's uniform complaint procedures specified in AR 1312.3 - Uniform Complaint Procedures.

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that the student handbook clearly describes the district's nondiscrimination policy, procedures for filing a complaint regarding discrimination, harassment, intimidation, or bullying, and the resources that are available to students who feel that they have been the victim of any such behavior. The district's policy shall also be posted on the district web site or any other location that is easily accessible to students.

When required pursuant to Education Code 48985, complaint forms shall be translated into the student's primary language.

## RESIGNATION

**BB 9222** Board Bylaws

A Governing Board member who wishes to resign may do so by filing a written resignation with the County Superintendent of Schools.

As a courtesy, the resigning Board member should also notify the Board and give a copy of his/her written resignation to the Board secretary.

The resignation shall become effective when filed with the County Superintendent, except when a deferred effective date is specified in the resignation. A Board member may not defer the effective date of his/her resignation for more than 60 days after he/she files the resignation with the County Superintendent.

Once filed, a written resignation, whether specifying a deferred effective date or otherwise, shall be irrevocable.

A Board member who tenders his/her resignation with a deferred effective date shall, until the effective date of the resignation, continue to exercise all the powers of the office, except that he/she shall not have the right to vote for his/her successor in an action taken by the Board to make a provisional appointment.

A Board member who resigns shall file, within 30 days of leaving office, a revised Statement of Economic Interest/Form 700 covering the period of time between the closing date of the last statement required to be filed and the date he/she leaves office.
